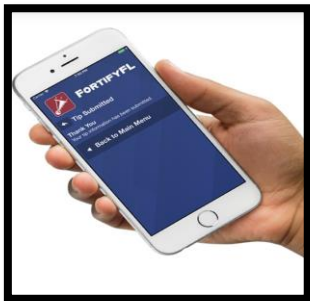

Clinic Cards

Each student has received a first day packet with a yellow clinic card. Please fill out the card completely and return it to the school as soon as possible. It is more important than ever that we have current parent and emergency contact numbers for each student.



Pinellas County Schools has partnered with Sandy Hook Promise to offer the Say Something Anonymous Reporting System. This builds on the Say Something program and includes an anonymous reporting system via a downloadable app, telephone hotline, and website that students can use to report an issue when they see a classmate who is at risk of harming themselves or others.



Additionally, the district utilizes FortifyFL, a suspicious activity reporting tool that allows individuals to instantly provide a description of the threat, share pictures and videos, and optionally submit their contact information to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials. FortifyFL was created and funded by 2018 Florida Legislature as part of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Act.
