Benefits of Dual

01 Students have the opportunity to earn college credit for free.

02 Students get to experience classes on different campuses to learn more about their interests

03 Students get college AND high school credit

04 When applying to Universities, admissions reps will see student has taken higher-level classes

Different Types

Full Time

SPC offers two full time Dual Programs. Juniors or Seniors can spend their entire day at SPC, while still having access to Tech High events.

Part Time

Students can take up to 3 class at SPC or enroll in a program at PTC for 3 class periods.

On Campus

We currently offer Comp 1 and 2 and Career Exploration at Tech High. Both of those classes give students college credit.

Full Time SPC

Early College

Students spend their Junior and Senior year at SPC fulltime, earning their AA and high school diploma.

Part time SPC

- 01** Students can take up to 3 classes at SPC (if their schedule allows it).
- 02** Students get release periods for every class they take; they cannot stay on campus during release periods and must have transportation to SPC
- 03** Registration for part time dual is done with the student's school counselor. Available for 11th and 12th graders.
- 04** Enrollment will be begin in March. Monitor the Sunday call for more information about deadlines

On Campus

- On campus classes subject to change
- Students will communicate with their counselor during course registration if they want to take a Dual class offered on campus at Tech High
- Currently offering: Composition 1, Composition 2, and College/Career Planning.
- Each class is 1 semester long.

Create SPC account

Google “SPC Application” and click on the high school programs application

Research Classes

Google SPC Class lists and look at classes available

Fill out Form

See your counselor for a dual enrollment form and submit it to them when finished filling it out

PTech

- PTC offers dual enrollment for some of their programs
- Students need to have 3 class periods available in their schedule to take classes at PTC (usually morning classes)
 - Application window is Jan 5-April 1
- Students will apply online; need 2.0 unweighted GPA
- Check out Programs available at PTC's website (look at both campuses)

Other Options

- UF has a dual enrollment program
 - Classes offered online
 - Students can apply here:

- Students can also take AP classes to earn college credit

AP vs Dual

AP

- Only earn credit if you pass the AP exam
- does not impact college GPA

Dual

- Earn college grade and impacts college GPA
- Earn credit if you pass the class

Both

- Weighted the same for high school GPA
- Can earn college credit

Student Responsibility

- Students are taking college-level classes with professors and college students
 - College Instructors will not communicate with parents or school staff
- It is the student's responsibility to stay on top of assignments and speak with their counselor if there is an issue
 - These classes will impact their college GPA
- Students should take the lead on enrolling for Dual Enrollment courses

Next Steps

- If you want to dual enroll next semester at SPC, speak with your counselor ASAP (Nov 20 is the deadline)
- If you want to apply for fulltime Dual at SPC, attend one of the upcoming meetings for more information (first one Nov. 3)
- If you want to Dual Enroll at PTC next year, apply in January
- If you want to do parttime Dual enrollment at SPC next year, let your counselor know when you are speaking with them about your course schedule for next year
