### PCSB Code of Civility

- The education of a child happens only through a partnership between the child, school faculty and staff, parent(s) or guardian(s), the community and district office employees. Partnership is an active state that includes sharing responsibilities, having meaningful communication and welcomed participation.
- When people who are working together agree, the partnership runs smoothly. Two
  people will not always agree, and that can make partnership difficult. The partnership is

- We hear of harmful actions, such as road rage, physical confrontation, ethnic stereotypes and slurs. But civility is not just an absence of harm.







### Graduation Requirements (Traditional)

- 24 credits (4 English, 4 Math, 3 Science, 3 Social Studies, 1 HOPE, 1 Art, and electives)
- Maintain a minimum 2.0 Grade Point Average (this is a "C" average of all of your semester and year-long courses, not the 9-week GPA)
- Pass the 10th Grade FSA and Algebra 1 End of Course (EOC) Exam
- Pass one online course
- These are the absolute minimum standards to receive our diploma. If you intend to continue on to college, you'll need to do more:
  - Take at least two years of Foreign Language,
  - Take an Honors, Dual Enrollment, and/or AP course,
  - Earn high qualifying scores on the PERT, ACT and/or SAT,
  - Maintain the highest GPA you can throughout your HS career!





### How Can We Help You Get Into College?


- Take AVID as an elective (we have over 450 kids who do already!)
- Honors level courses in all core subjects and many electives
- Dual Enrollment courses are available for 11<sup>th</sup> + 12<sup>th</sup> grade students who qualify with a 3.0 or high GPA and a high PERT, ACT, or SAT score. Passing a dual enrollment course with a final grade of "C" or better earns HS credit and 3 College Credits at the same time
- Advanced Placement courses are available to everyone, but require a lot of extra work, reading, studying, and good attendance/effort
  - AP exams are graded by the College Board on a scale of 1 to 5
  - A score of 3 or higher on an AP exam earns college credit
- Take AP Capstone Seminar in 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> grade, followed by AP Capstone Research in 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade
- Students who take honors, dual enrollment, and advanced placement courses will face a more challenging curriculum and will be better prepared for college (regardless of the score on an AP exam)

### WHY PRE-AP?

Pre-AP frameworks and assessments are the foundation for all sections of the Pre-AP courses at our school.

Pre-AP Courses are intentionally designed to provide grade-level course work based on high school content, skills, and expectations.

Increasing access to this type of coursework leads to increased opportunities for all students, including groups that have been traditionally underrepresented in college classrooms.




# School Essentials
