




How would you rate the overall quality of the education at your child's school? (N=57)








Academic Support: Comparison Over Time














This past school year, have you reached out to teachers/school staff with a need or concern? (N=56)




Perceptions of Communication with Teachers and School Staff










Perceptions of Communication with School Leadership



















School-level Net Promoter Score


If you had a family member or friend moving to the area, how likely are you to recommend they send their child to your child's school? (N=49)



How do the following areas impact your rating of your child's school?





District-level Net Promoter Score


If you had a family member or friend moving to the area, how likely are you to recommend Pinellas County Schools? (N=56)


