## Luke Loucks

Luke Loucks was a 4 year varsity basketball player (2004-2008) and 3 year varsity football player (2004, 2006-2008) at Clearwater High School.

In football, Loucks threw for over 3000 yards and 20 touchdowns as a quarterback his junior and senior season. In 2006-2007, he set the single game passing record, throwing for 423 yards and 4 touchdowns in a win over Palm Harbor.

In basketball, Loucks was ranked as the best point guard prospect in Florida, a top ten point guard nationally, and a top 100 player nationally. He finished with the most wins and games played in Clearwater High history. Loucks finished top 5 in career assists, steals, rebounds and top 10 in career scoring for the Tornadoes.

Loucks graduated from Clearwater High with a 3.9 GPA and was a part of the national honor society.

After Clearwater, Loucks went on to play point guard for the Florida State University basketball team. He was the first player in school history to lead the Seminoles to four straight NCAA tournament appearances, including a Sweet 16 in 2010. Loucks led the Seminoles to their first ACC Championship as the starting point guard in 2012, while earning first team All-ACC Tournament honors and setting the all time single game assist record in the ACC Championship game with 13. He finished his 4 year career with the most wins in school history, most games played in school history, and top 10 in career assists. He graduated with an undergraduate degree in Business, a master's degree in Sports Management, and was awarded 3 ACC All Academic awards for athletic and academic achievement from 2009-2012.

After Florida State, Loucks went on to play basketball professionally in Latvia, Cyprus, Belgium, Germany, and in the NBA's minor league with the Boston Celtics and Orlando Magic organizations.

After retiring as an athlete, Loucks began his coaching career with the Golden State Warriors in the NBA. He won two NBA Championships in 2017 and 2018 and appeared in a third NBA Championship in 2019. Loucks was an assistant coach for the Nigerian National team in the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games. In 2021, he joined the Phoenix Suns and helped the Suns win an NBA high and Franchise record 67 games while winning another Pacific Division Title. In 2022, Loucks joined the Sacramento Kings coaching staff, where he helped the Kings end the

longest playoff drought in sports history and win another Pacific Division title. Loucks served as the Head Coach for the Sacramento Kings in the 2023 NBA Summer League, winning 5 of his 7 games.

He and his wife, Stevi, have 3 children named Charli, Cobi, and Crosby, and live in Carmichael, California.
