#### **State College**

Offer 2-year degrees (can transfer to University) and 4-year degree -SPC

## Technical College

Offers certifications for technical fields -PTC



# APPLICATION PROCESS FOR WINVERSITIES

Create list of schools to apply to

Research application requirements

Create Common
App Account

Complete applications on Common

App

Send test scores from College Board account

Once applications are submitted fill out SSAR (or school equlivant)



# Admissions Information

- -Rolling Admissions: Students can submit applications within the window and will receive a decision within a few weeks. The earlier you apply, the better the chances!
- -Priority Deadline: Students should apply by this deadline for the best chance at admissions and financial aid
- -Early Decision: Students should only apply to this deadline is they are 100% sure they want to attend the University. If students are accepted under this deadline, they must withdraw their applications from other schools.
  - -Regular Decision: This the last date to apply.
- -Summer Session: Some schools offer freshmen Summer sessions. For some unviersities, the applicant pool for the Summer is less competitive than the Fall.

September/ October: College Application season

November 1st: Submit applications



# MOST UNIVERSITY APPLICANTIONS SHOULD BE SUBMITTED BY NOVEMBER 1ST



-In the past, we have used a site called Naviance to send transcripts and request recommendations.

The district is moving to a new system called Xello next year.

This is a requirement, and you will be keeping your college list and acceptance progress here.

# State and Federal Grants

Based on financial need, the government will give students money to go to college

#### **Scholarships**

Students can apply for many scholarships based on their high school achievements.

#### Loans

Students can take out
loans to cover the
remaining cost of school
(they must pay it back)





# FAFSA

-FAFSA is the federal financial aid application families must fill out to qualifies for any financial assistance.

-Colleges will use this information to determine if they will give additional aid to students.

-We will have a FAFSA information night, a FAFSA ID creation night, and a FAFSA completion night at Tech High (the district will host events at other schools if families cannot attend the night at Tech High).



# Florida Financial Aid Application

- This application is where you apply to Bright

   Futures and other scholarships

   This is a scholarship available to all students in the state of Florida.
- -This is intended to be used at college in state.
  -Students will fill out a small application to make sure they are considered.
  -Students can use this scholarship for Technical colleges.



## FLORIDA BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP

A renewable scholarship that provides incentive for academically talented students to stay in-state for college. If qualifications are met, students must submit the Florida Financial Aid Application no later than August 31 after high school graduation. Awards are on first-come, first serve basis. Must be a Florida resident to qualify.
