Student Attendance Policy

Oldsmar Elementary School follows the Pinellas County School Board's student attendance policy as described in the current Code of Student Conduct (pg. 33-36) distributed at the beginning of the school year. An absence will be considered excused if the office receives a phone call on the day of the absence, an email is sent to the teacher, notification of absence on school website, or a note is received by the teacher explaining a child's absence within two days. The following are the only excused reasons for missing school:

- The student is ill or injured.
- There is a major illness in the student's immediate family.
 - Student is quarantined.
 - There is a death in the immediate family.
- The student is attending religious education or there is a religious holiday in the student's own faith.
 - The student is required by summons, subpoena, or court order to appear in court.
- Special Event such as public function, conferences, or state/national competitions. The student must get permission from the principal at least 5 days prior to the absence.
 - The student has a scheduled medical or dental appointment (documentation should be provided).
- Students having, or suspected of having, a communicable disease or infestation which can be transmitted are to be excluded from school and are not allowed to return to school until they no longer present a health hazard. Absences not reported by phone call, email, online notification, or note to the teacher will be considered unexcused. Vacation, travel and family visits are considered an unexcused absence. Every three unexcused extreme tardies or early sign outs in a grading period are also considered an unexcused absent. Tardies and early sign outs are considered excused for the same reasons listed above. Classwork/homework is required to be made up during or after an absence. Upon return to school following an absence, the student is given as many days to make up work as days absent. Students who demonstrate a consistent pattern of non-attendance may be referred to the school's Child Study Team. A student who has been absence for five days or more in a grading period may, upon request of the administration, be required to present a certificate of illness from a licensed physician.



TOYS FOR TOTS – Registration is open from September 1 – November 10

Pinellas County Schools is partnering with the "TOYS FOR TOTS" program in Pinellas County to meet the needs of our students and their families. "TOYS FOR TOTS" is able to provide low income families with gifts for up to five children, ages infant-12 years old. The number of gifts provided is based on availability at the time of your scheduled appointment. TOYS FOR TOTS strives to provide each child with at least one chosen toy, a stuffed animal, one game (maximum of 3 per family,) one coloring book, and stocking stuffers. Bicycles may also be available (one bike per family) and must be requested at the start of your appointment, if you would like one.

Eligibility Criteria

- 1.Resident of and children living in Pinellas County
 - 2. Children ages 12 and under as of 12/25/24

3. Financial need (i.e., receiving financial assistance of some type, homeless, or has recently had life changing event such as unemployment, fire, hurricane damage, etc.)

How to Request Toys from Toys for Tots

- 1. Go to https://t4tpinellas.ptaptsa.org/pre-registration between September 1 November 10th to register. Registration will close once all appointments are full.
- 2. Enter your e-mail address. You will receive an email from Toys for Tots with a link to the registration page.
- 3. Fill out the form entering your family name, address, and your preferred date and time for toy pickup as well as information for each child (ages 12 and under) by adding their name, age and school they attend. Submit the registration request after confirming all information is correct. The screen should now tell you that you have an application pending. You can check the status of any application at any time by going to https://t4tpinellas.ptaptsa.org/pre-registration and re-entering the email address you used at registration.
- 4. You will receive an e-mail acknowledging your request and another email when you have been approved by December 10th.
 - 5. You will receive a confirmation e-mail.
 - You MUST acknowledge this email and confirm your appointment by December 15th.
 - ·Failure to respond will remove you from the approved list.
 - Upon acknowledgement of this email you will receive your bar code.
- 6. Toy pick up will be held on 12/20/24 and 12/21/24. Toys for Tots will send you an e-mail with the pick-up location. Please arrive no earlier than 30 minutes prior to your scheduled appointment. You must bring your bar code with you to distribution (either on your phone or a printed copy).
