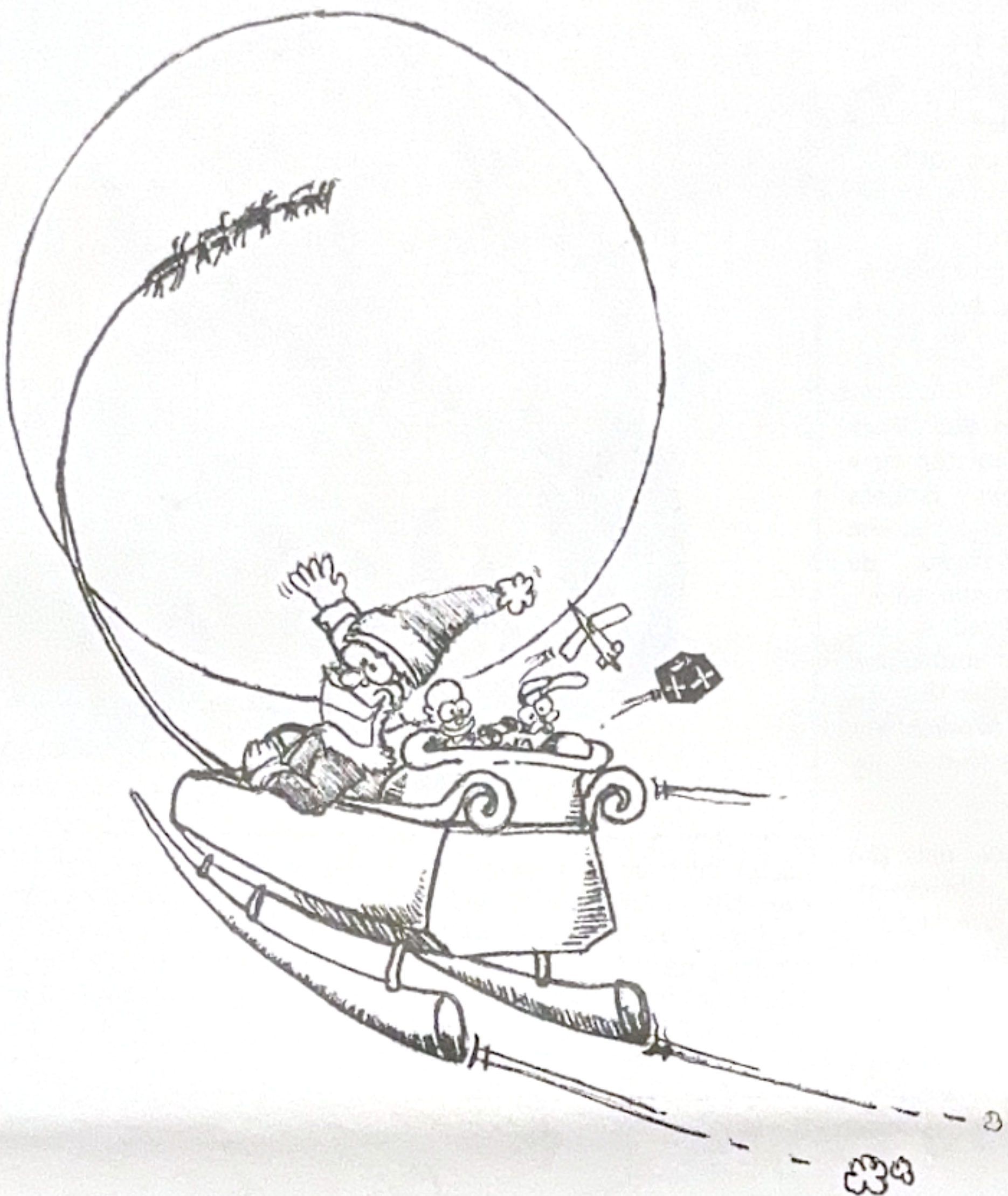

Band parades talent

The Viking band has completed its 1987 marching season undefeated on the field, defending its undefeated title on Dec. 5 in Al Lang Stadium against bands from throughout the state.

The contest was a climactic close to a season that started out with a victory.

To open its season, the Viking band started with a win at the Seminole Sound Spectacular, defeating bands from all over the county. The Vikings also won best brass and best woodwinds at that competition.

On Oct. 10 at Largo High School, the Vikings once again took top honors in a contest of bands in the state including one from the east coast, and again won best brass, making the brass line undefeated.

Three weeks later, at the Clearwater High School Tornado Tournament, the Vikings put everything on the line against a fierce rival, the Largo High School Band of Gold. Largo is highly respected all over the state and rarely loses to anyone, but the Vikings rose to the occasion by defeating Largo with a score of 96.2. Once again the Viking band brass line took best brass and the woodwind section took best woodwinds.

The gobbled turkey

"It was decided to cancel the contest because teachers might be offended by winning the contest, as the name 'turkey' could be taken in different ways," Patricia Coldiron, SGA sponsor, said. The contest was "strictly for fun," according to Steve Halle, SGA vice president, but "kids took it out of context," Coldiron said.

The \$3.50 collected for votes was donated to the student activity fund with an explanation, because the money could not be returned, and "SGA could think of nothing else to do with it," Coldiron said.

NEHI blood

In the last Community Blood Bank drive held at Northeast on Nov. 23 and 24, Northeast gave 136 pints of blood. Northeast still leads the county in the amount of blood donated each year by high schools.

Student dies in crash

A Northeast student, Tammy Russ, 14, died from injuries sustained in a Jeep accident involving four other NEHI students on Dec. 3. The Jeep, driven by Beth Anne Shipley, 15, flipped into a canal next to 54 Ave. N., between 4 and 9 streets.

St. Petersburg Police Officer Rusty Gates, who is in charge of the accident investigation, stated, "The way it seems, Shipley's Jeep was headed east on 54 Ave. and she overreacted to another vehicle, there was no evidence that she was cut off. We're confident there was no other car."

According to the *St. Petersburg Times*, Shipley told police that she was driving in the right hand lane when she realized there was a fast-moving car approaching her from behind. She told police she switched to the left lane to let the car pass, but the car followed. She then said that she switched back over to the right and lost control of the car.

According to Gates, police could not verify through witnesses that there was, in fact, another car.

"The marks on the road were not skid marks, they were yaw marks, marks from the rims of a rolling tire which are caused by a sudden movement," said Gates.

As of now, no charges have been filed, but Gates feels that charges are forthcoming.

"We haven't gotten around to that part yet, because this is such a lengthy process. There will be charges but until they are filed, I cannot appropriately comment. I will say that there will be charges from all angles, not only against Beth Anne and her husband, but also against those who were not wearing seatbelts," said Gates.

None of the girls in the Jeep were wearing seatbelts, according to police.

The driver of the car, Beth Anne Shipley, was driving with a restricted license, according to police.

Those injured in the accident were Beth Anne Shipley; Jennifer Shipley, 15, Beth Anne Shipley's sister-in-law; Jolie Mosley, 14, and Hiedi Ermatinger, 15; all Northeast Students. Only two of the girls, Mosley and Ermatinger, were hospitalized, according to the *St. Petersburg Times*.

So before you pick up that drink or take that careless risk, think twice. If that doesn't work, think hard and if that doesn't phase you...think of Tammy Russ. We don't want it to be you Northeast mourns after the holidays.

Economics Classes make "Money"

Northeast High was chosen as one of the top schools for teaching economics, or personal money management, by *Money* magazine.

"We were pretty proud to hear about that," said Robert Babcock, one of the teachers of this course. "Mr. Zachary had a smile on his face, also."

An article which was printed in the magazine's December issue states that Northeast High is among the 10 schools in the country that already are "first rate" in teaching personal finance, the magazine said. The economics courses are taught by William Alden and Robert Babcock.

"We were pleased to learn that Northeast was recognized by *Money* magazine as having one of the two best economic programs in the nation. Mr. Alden and I have continued to build on the economic understanding already provided in other subjects taught at Northeast."

The economics course taught at Northeast is a strict graduation requirement. Every senior must pass it in order to graduate. The course involves many aspects of the American economy.

During the first six weeks, students are introduced to the various political systems, social science terms, the political spectrum, the nature of government and economics.

The second six weeks goes into a little more depth with business

organizations, labor, supply and demand and a New York Stock Exchange activity. Each student is given 100,000 in which to invest.

"When the stocks crashed, students began to have a very negative attitude toward the stock market. Now they are starting to recover," said Babcock.

"The stock market game has proven to be a rewarding experience for our students, even if at the end of our investment period they have lost money, they learn that all investments have a degree of risk. If they beat the trend of a down market, we are all equally pleased because they made a wise investment," said Babcock.

In the third six weeks, students are challenged with the

concepts of financial institutions, non-financial institutions, taxation and revenue, federal budget and expenditures, the gross national product, economic growth, business cycles, inflation and deflation, monetary and fiscal policy and economic

interdependence. "We are constantly searching for and presenting new ways to present the material so our students leave Northeast with the ability to handle the real world," said Babcock.

'Exam'ining Science shows off the schedule

Exams are coming up very quickly at Northeast. After numerous proposed exam schedule plans, one has finally been settled upon for the first semester.

On Friday, Jan. 15, one examination will be administered. This will be from 7:30 until 9:30 a.m. Following this exam, students will follow a shortened version of the remainder of the school day.

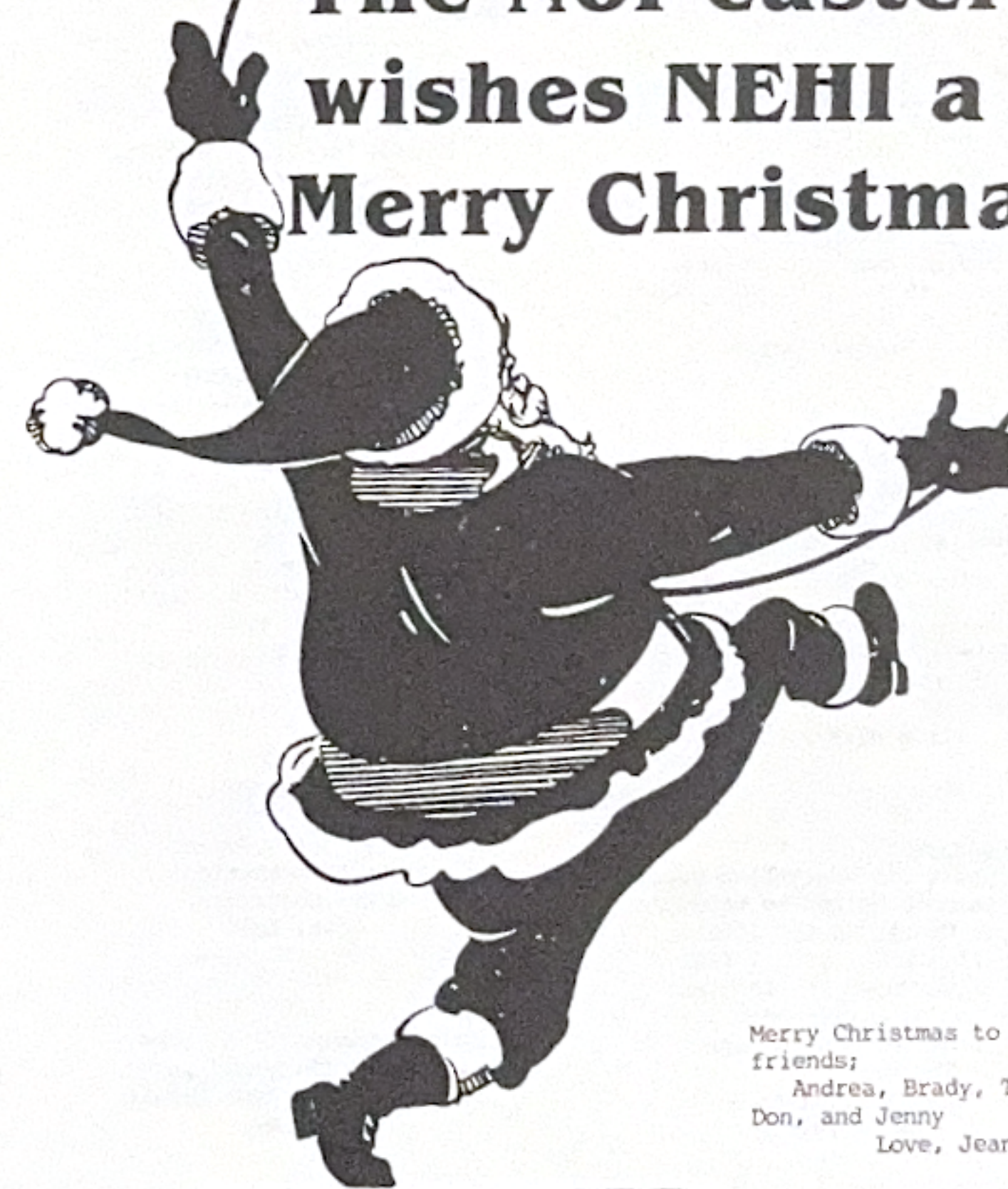

Mixing business with school

"There is a definite misconcep-
tion about the Cooperative
Education Program," said Bar-
bara Elson, department head. "It
is not an easy way out of school.
The student not only has to man-
tain a 2.0 grade point average
but also has to have a good atten-
dance record. It's our school's
belief that to be successful in this
program, you, the student, must
be an extremely responsible
person."

The Cooperative Education
Program, with a total of 134
students, consists of four in-
dividual classes: Fashion
Marketing, General Marketing,
Health Occupations and
Cooperative Business. Students
must be a junior or senior, be at
least 16 years of age and must
maintain a grade point average
of a 2.0.

Earning well over minimum
wage, students in the Coop pro-
gram work an average of 16
hours a week. They leave school
after fourth period and work un-
til 5 p.m., usually.

The grading system is quite
difficult, Elson said. Class par-
ticipation, tests and homework
make up only half of the grade.
The employer evaluates each stu-
dent each six week period. The
two grades are then combined for
a final six week average.

Fashion Marketing, taught by
Elson, prepares students for a
career in the apparel industry.
While exploring the fashion in-
dustry, students are employed by
department stores such as Maas
Brothers, Burdines, Up's and
Down's, Colony Shops and Sacino
and Sons. The Fashion
Marketing students also take
part in fashion shows and teen
boards to enhance their career
possibilities.

The Cooperative Business Pro-
gram, taught by Debbie Fischer,
is a program that requires ac-
quired skills. Clerical and
secretarial experience is
necessary, including one year of
typing class. Cooperative
Business students work as
secretaries, bookkeepers and at
jobs that require paper work and
filing. The Cooperative Business
program is an excellent reference

for future jobs, Fischer said.

"The Cooperative Education
Program is not for everybody.
You have to juggle five classes,

the field and defended its undefeated title.

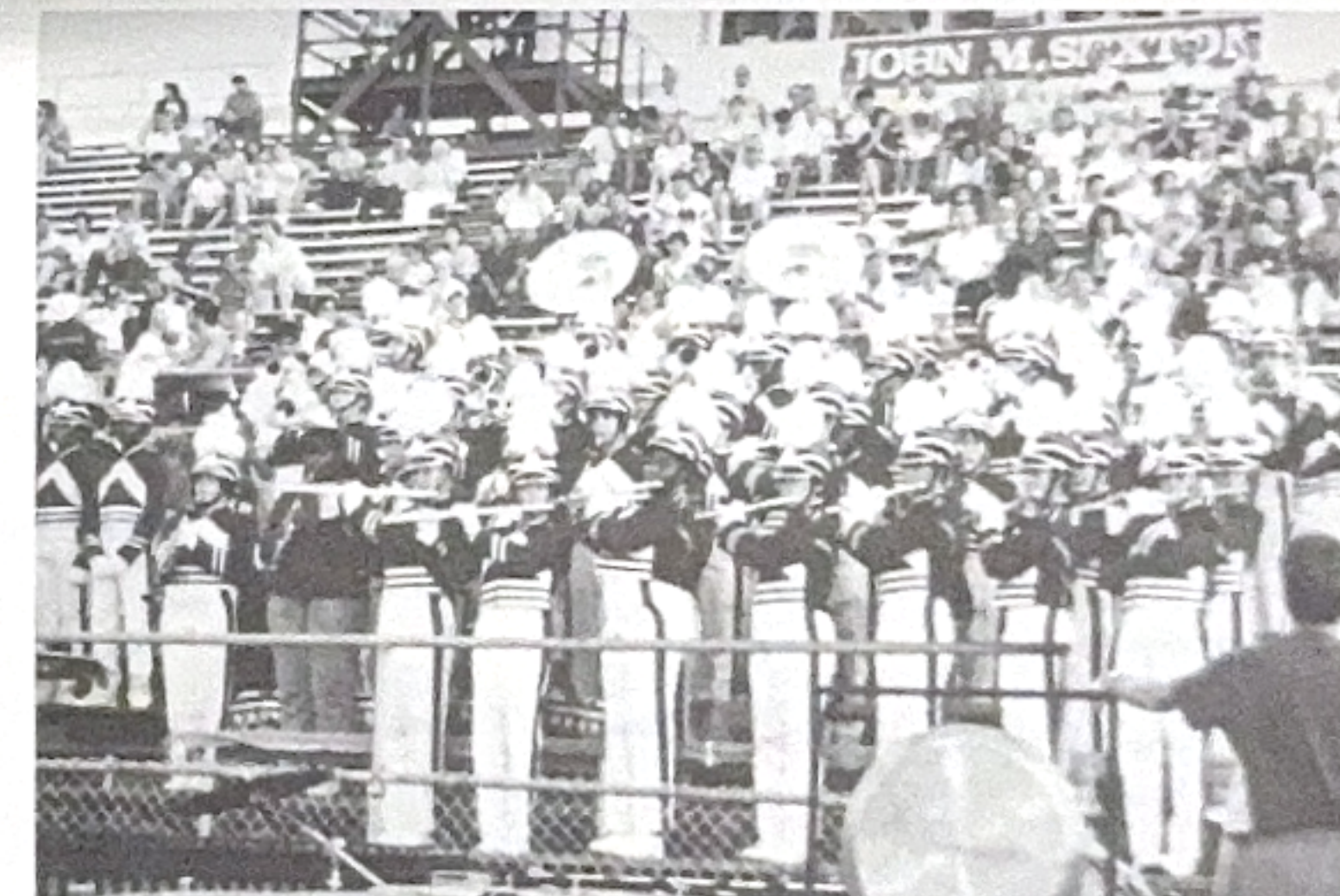
"I would say that this performance was

Illiteracy aid available

Virginia Gildrie, a fiesty lady in her senior years, heads the local chapter of the Coalition of Literacy (COL). COL teaches adults to read through a twelve-month process involving teaching reading through phonics. Tutoring sessions are held through the community school system, including a group at Northeast High School.

Gildrie got involved with the COL in 1973. The local office is run through her St. Petersburg home. She confessed, "I devote a lot of time to this, but I wouldn't do it unless I loved it!" Gildrie devotes about 40 hours a week to the COL.

Through Project Literacy U.S. (PLUS), awareness of the drastic problem of illiteracy has become known. "Bluffing It" is a TV movie starring Dennis Weaver about a man who was illiterate. The movie resulted of calls to the COL national office, with many people asking for help and others to volunteer. Included in the alarming statistics: two out of three Americans are il-

literate and 30 percent of Americans will be illiterate in the year 2000.

The COL is a non-profit organization. Their expenses are minimal. Gildrie and the other workers receive no wages for their work. The only major expenses Gildrie has is the telephone and copy machine. Donations are accepted and are received from the public and private sector.

Students are taught at no cost. They do have to pay for their own books and work books. The prices are kept low and those who can not afford books are given them free. Teachers, as well as students, pay for their own material.

COL uses the LAMOARE system, the system is divided into four books. When a student completes the fourth book, he is done with the program. Finishing the program results in a reading level comparable to a sixth grader. The system usually takes about 12 months.

Lessons are given twice a week. Tutors have to devote themselves to the program because the students are dependent on the teachers' help. Northeast has been involved in the program for 14 months. Community School Principal Karl Nousanian said, "We are very proud of this program."



"Overall, our experience in Russia was very interesting and a good learning experience."




