Universities are Taking Action About SAT Scores

SAT testing is stressed upon by our high school and many others. This test is so important because it has national outreach and stands as one of the qualifications to enter colleges and universities. A good number of universities have a specific score that must be met or surpassed for a student to be accepted there. This means that students are forced to not only take this reading and math test, but also pass it with flying colors in order to secure their future.

Raenna Cody, a 12th grade student here at Northeast feels that "the SAT has a lot of pressure surrounding it, which I think is what makes testing for it so hard." High schools have inadvertently attached so much anxiety to the SAT, even though they are just trying to help students gain more opportunities with higher test scores. They do not realize how much that anxiety really affects the testing experience and score.

There isn't much else high schools can do to help students succeed in the system that is in place, but some universities are starting to see the flaws in how the SAT is presented and are beginning to change the system. Dozens of universities have begun to make SAT scores optional to the acceptance of students.

Raenna agrees that universities should be less dependent on SAT scores for acceptance because "... it does provide hope for the students who aren't great test takers but still have great grades and great effort." Less pressure geared toward one test score allows students to focus on what should be most important: their grades.

There is a pattern in all of

the universities that have chosen to become test optional for admissions. They tend to be liberal arts because talent in arts doesn't have much correlation to the standard test, so holding students back because of it is unfair. But there are some major traditional universities that are starting to follow the test optional trend. As of now, "At least 1,900 schools are still test optional, and at least 80 are test free" according to the National Center for Fair and Open Testing and Spectrum News. The number of schools beginning this practice grows every fall semester.

Also, during the pandemic, major universities such as Harvard and Stanford tried their hand at test optional policy because of the sudden cut-off of access to the SAT and ACT tests. But these universities have switched back to requiring test scores after the pandemic passed. These Ivy League Schools believe that "...standardized test scores make the school's admissions process more merit-based," which means that SAT scores more accurately display if a student is ready for college than their grades do. This is not entirely accurate because students can be brilliant. but still fail tests due to the test environment or having several questions that were not taught well or at all by their high schools. Putting a student's future set of opportunities into the hands of a randomized set of questions seems unfair.

Some universities are opening up doors for students to succeed and have life-changing opportunities without an SAT and/or ACT score, giving hope to thousands of excited high school students. But it is still important to practice for and take an SAT test because these tests will still be part of the college system for years to come. Phasing out a test completely, especially one as essential as the SAT, is almost impossible, and if it is, it will take many years. This transformation in some universities has only come in recent years, meaning that SAT and ACT testing will stick around for a while longer. Prepare well and explore all opportunities that come.

College Tests Move to Digital Format

The SAT is a standardized test that determines a student's preparedness for college through multiple choice and student response questions that include reading, writing, and math questions. This test is very important for college applications, for most colleges it is mandatory to submit your scores from one to even apply. Not only is it mandatory, but good scores will set you apart from your peers and improve your odds of getting accepted.

The first SAT given with an online option was in spring of 2023 but as of spring 2024 all in school SATs will be given to students online. Although one might think the switch to online wouldn't alter the test, that is not correct. The new online version of the test is shorter as before it was almost three hours and now it is just over two. Additionally, and arguably the biggest change, the online SAT is adaptive, meaning, if a student does not do well on the first half of the test the second half will be easier and if a student excels at the first half, they will have a more difficult second half.

NEHI students are being affected by this change first-hand as they are taking the tests to obtain the scores needed for college. Student perspectives on this switch seems conflicted about the effects. Sophomore, Phoebe Robinson, says,

"Overall, I do better with paper tests because it's tangible and it helps me focus more. Since I have a lot of screen time for other stuff automatically, I want to dose off so I think it going online would hinder my focus a bit."

For her as well as many others, online testing will be an adjustment because, for many kids, paper tests force them to focus on the task at hand and it is less likely for

On the contrary, Junior Katie Allen seems to really enjoy this new version of the test and think it could be beneficial to students, she said.

"I honestly think the online SAT is great, the turnaround time to get your scores is much quicker which I really appreciate, and I think it allows people to have more access to it and there are a lot more resources to learn how to take the test online."

While preparing for the test may look different now, it is still very possible. With the new test being on the computer it is easy to find practice tests on the internet that mimic the real one. Additionally, for teachers that help prepare their students for the test it is very similar. Ms. Bohl, a math teacher that uses her time to help prepare her students for these state tests, said,

"The types of question won't change and how they ask them because I looked at the online and it's not much different...I would probably approach it the same way because the questioning is still going to be roughly the same."

Although how teacher prepare their students may not change, it is important to see how a professional tutor might adjust their methods of teaching kids how to successfully pass these state tests. Kim Stroemich, a tutor who specializes in SAT and ACT prep said,

"What I teach students in terms of the underlying curriculum, nothing in that is different... the only difference in what I have to do with students is helping them figure out how to adjust to having a paper in front of them..."

At the end of the day, the online SAT is not hugely different from the prior paper version of the tests and although kids will have to learn to adjust to the computer test, it shouldn't greatly effect their scores. As long as they properly prepare for the test by using the available resources, they should be successful when taking the new version.

Unseen and Undeserved: The Silent **Epidemic** of Medical **Mistrust Among African American** Women

In life, there is often an underestimation of the privilege one possesses. Some may measure theirs by receiving a free drink at a local coffee shop, while some gauge theirs on a person's age, money, or ability to obtain particular things. However, one of the most underrated privileges remains the ability to seek medical attention and be genuinely seen and listened to by healthcare professionals.

The tragic demise of beauty influencer Jessica Pettway struck multiple communities as she was the face and voice for herself and many others. In an Instagram post from the previous year, the 36-yearold mother of two explained how, in 2022, her husband found her unconscious on their bathroom floor. despite her initial concerns about her heavy vaginal bleeding, which she later determined to be normal after consulting with others. After feeling extremely weak and exhausted, Jessica visited several doctors, only to be diagnosed with Fibroid Syndrome and sent home by each one. Her care remained superficial, indifferent, and unconcerned even after the diagnosis. Jessica eventually found a doctor who would listen to her after multiple hospital stays and worsening symptoms. By this time, she had already had ten blood transfusions and had an undetected cervix. Upon being referred to an oncologist, she was casually informed upon waking from anesthetic that she had stage 3 cervical cancer. With a post on Instagram that read, "I could hear God reminding me to live," Jessica showed her steadfast belief. "And I am doing precisely that." The colorful beauty expert succumbed to her illness after multiple hospital stays, significant weight loss, a level 4 hemoglobin, and more than eighteen blood transfusions overall.

Ms. Britt, Northeast's very own Environmental Science and Credit Recovery teacher, revealed that she became aware of the reality of African American women being mistreated by doctors when she visited Bayfront Health following a malady with her health. Ms. Britt said in an interview that after inquiring with her doctor about her state of health—who just so happened to be wearing cowboy boots—she was told, "I am the doctor." She revealed that because of this experience, she neglected her own health because as she was afraid to ask any questions. "Ever since that happened, I've never been to Bayfront again," she went on to explain. Due to this single incident, Ms. Britt saw multiple physicians and medical facilities, which prevented her from receiving the prompt assistance she so needed. "After that, I never went to Bayfront again," she commented. Black women and women of color need to be particularly when seeking medical care for health issues.

At length, the systematic mistreatment of African American women by healthcare professionals is a deeply concerning issue that demands urgent attention and action. Younger women of color are advised, according to the Washington Post, to research what

exams and procedures at each stage of their life. For instance, knowing when to get a cholesterol test, when to get a pap screening, and how often to have blood work done are all crucial. Young black females, especially in a society that might not consider you a real patient, prioritize your physical health and work to be your own best healthcare advocate.

With being closer to the equator and higher UV indexes here, sun protection is even more important since UV rays damage skin cells. But for residents, this tends to be something that is pushed aside for many.

Everyone knows the tourist look of lobster-colored skin and the realization of how important sunscreen is. Many of us spend our days outside at the beach, playing sports and not using sunscreen while fully aware of the repercussions. The short-term effects from the sun are sunburn, peeling skin, or sun poisoning, but in the long run skin cancer is the risk. Many are too careless to use any type of

skin protection or are too worried about behind a tan.

Meanwhile, Florida has the second highest rate of skin cancer in the United States, more than 600 Floridians die of melanoma every year; since 1975, the number of deaths among residents older than age 50 has almost doubled.

Students were asked if they wear sunscreen on a daily basis, 52% said they do not wear sunscreen daily, 29% said they do occasionally, and 19% said they do wear sunscreen daily. Sunscreen isn't the only type of sun protection that should be used either; using shade, wearing longer clothing or darker colors, sunglasses, and hats are all important ways to protect your skin from damage.

According to the World Health Organization, some individual risk factors for skin cancer include fair skin, blue, green or hazel eyes, light-colored hair, the tendency to burn rather than suntan, a history of severe sunburns, many moles, freckles, and a family history of skin cancer. One in every three cancers diagnosed is a skin cancer and, according to Skin Cancer Foundation Statistics, one in every five Americans will develop skin cancer in their lifetime.

Athletes are one group that spends a lot of time out in the sun, so they are more prone to getting skin cancer meaning it is more important for them to be protecting their skin. Lacrosse player Tyson Severs shares "I practice outside every day for 2-4 hours and don't wear sunscreen unless I'm at a tournament."

It's not just athletes prone to skin cancer though, it is very common for people to sit outside and tan, or just live day to day out in the sun not realizing how much they are putting themselves in harm's way. Sophie Ellis, who plays lacrosse and works out on the beach, says "I wear sunscreen on my face every day, I put it on as a part of my morning routine, and I wear it to work because I don't want to harm my skin."

I did some research and went down to Denver Park to interview some Northeast students who play almost every weekend.
























Looking at the last five years, it has become increasingly harder to live because of the inflation. More and more graduates are finding it harder to move out of the house without finding scholarships, second jobs or even help from their parents.

The COVID pandemic caused inflation to "reach a high of 9% in June of 2022" (Klein, 2024) . Prices of goods and living since have averaged 19% higher then before COVID. These price changes have effected everyone and have caused more homeless, poor or even average wealth. It is so much harder to live not only for adults but graduating students.

In order for anyone to live even an average life now, people get second jobs, apply for tons of scholarships and ask other people motivated to complete her work on time. Some students like not having a teacher to nag on them to do work, so online is a good option to get work done when you want to, as well as when you have the proper time to complete assignments.

However, Concordia University Texas says there is not only less in person interaction but, technology fails and multiple distractions. While one is online there is not a person to the right or left to ask for help or have quick access
