Financial aid is a useful tool that is accessible exclusively to students who are wanting to attend post-secondary schooling. Some of the ways to acquire financial aid are by filling out the FAFSA and the scholarships that are available to students.

Mrs. Alvarez, who is in charge of college and career readiness, said, “The FAFSA is an early steppingstone for other financial aid. This the first and very most important step, that happens when you are a senior”.

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is a form you fill out to determine your eligibility for financial aid. In order

to fill out you will need to create an FSA ID, along with your parents to sign it. Some info you will need to fill it out is the high school you’re attending, some colleges you want to go to, some information about your parent’s finances, and then the student’s finances.

The FAFSA opens for applications the October 1st of your senior year. The most important thing to know when filling out this form is that it should be done before you enroll for college. The FAFSA is something you fill out every year, so if you want the financial aid that it may come with, you have to keep filling it out.

“It depends on the type of schools a student is planning to go to and what funding they need. One of the most important things a student will overlook is looking into the school they are planning to go to.” Alvarez said on the topic of what students should look for when

applying for scholarships.

If a student doesn’t believe they are eligible for a federal Pell Grant, they should definitely be researching other scholarships they may be able to receive. When looking into a school you will find out if there are scholarships that are automatically considered when you apply, or if there are scholarships that an application is required.

Mrs. Alvarez advises students to “be aware of Pinellas Education Foundation, which has a big catalog of scholarships that are all in one place for the Pinellas students to make it easier to apply. Even though they may be small, there is a higher chance of getting the scholarship because there is less competition.”

There are many places a student can look for scholarships. There are several reputable websites and even Bright Futures is also an option for scholarship mon-

ey.

The Pinellas Education Foundation has hundreds of scholarships available exclusively to Pinellas County students. You can also go to scholarship.com, unigo.com, and fastweb.com, which are reputable websites with scholarship options, in which you are competing with kids from all over the country. Bright Futures is a scholarship that anyone that is from and stays in Florida is eligible for. Even if you don’t take the scholarship money right away, you have 5 years after graduation to claim your scholarship.

Financial aid is something important if you are applying for colleges. All you need to do to start this process is filling out the FAFSA. If you need help with any of your financial aid needs, you can see Mrs. Alvarez.

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The Impact of the Florida Ban on Menstrual Cycle Education in Elementary Schools

On March 18th, Florida officials introduced a ban on menstruation discussions to elementary school classes. This bill is being sponsored by Florida Republican Representative Stan McClain who thinks that only children from grades 6 to 12 can learn about reproductive and sexual topics which includes periods.

Although young girls can still start their periods in fourth and fifth grade, they will not be allowed to discuss it during school; this includes asking a teacher any questions about her period or reproductive topics.

“I do not think it is fair to take that conversation away from

girls, since some of them cannot talk about it at home. It also makes the idea of a period a lot less normal and makes it seem like a bad thing,” said Junior Izzy Fowler.

The bill is also encouraging that reproductive roles are unchangeable. The Bill will change reproductive lessons for 6th-12th graders to where they would “teach that sex is determined by biology and reproductive function at birth; those biological males impregnate biological females by fertilizing the female egg with male sperm; that the female then gestates the offspring; and that these reproductive roles are binary, stable, and unchangeable.” (cbsnews.com)

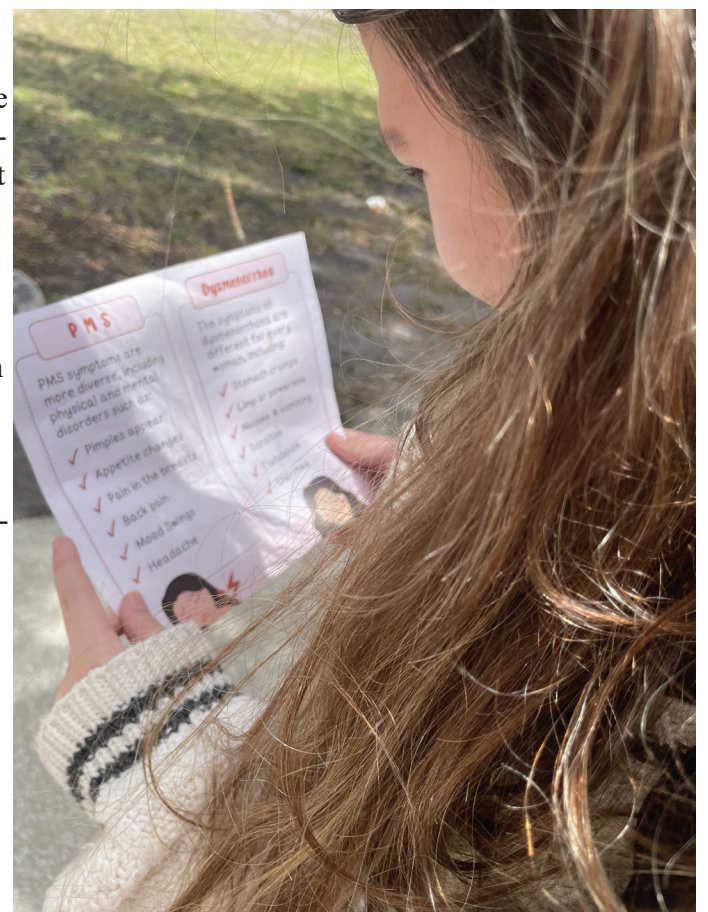
Changing the reproductive lesson would be unnecessary. The lesson should stick with teaching both male and female reproductive systems, how they work, and how to use protection. Implementing that reproductive role are unchangeable to children can send the wrong message rather than just informing them on how each system works.

“I believe that banning the

period talk for elementary school kid is unethical because many kids often experience it near that time, so for them to be uneducated at that time is unfair. The sexual lesson should be taught on a basic level, but they should not get as far as enforcing those roles and genders are unchangeable” Junior Jaelyn Johnson-Brown said.

Other than prohibiting menstrual conversations, the bill also encourages to “Teach abstinence from sexual activity outside of marriage as the expected standard for all school-age students while teaching the benefits of monogamous heterosexual marriage” to older students.

This can impact children



long-term from lack of knowledge on women’s bodies. If girls are growing up and not getting the amount of information they need about their own bodies, it can lead to unprotected sex and other uneducated and unsafe actions.

Stop W.O.K.E in College

Governor DeSantis’ plan to change education

In recent months, Governor DeSantis has announced the Stop W.O.K.E (Wrongs to Our Kids and Employees) Act, which limits how instructors can discuss race and gender in public universities and K-12 schools. Some of the effects of this act prohibit students from learning focused on minority histories, gender studies, or anything related to discrimination towards an oppressed group.

DeSantis claims that some classes encourage students to feel guilt or negativity toward the country and each other. He said that he “...we will not let the far-left woke

agenda take over our schools and workplaces.” (Time Magazine, Florida’s Governor Just Signed the ‘Stop Woke Act.’ Here’s What It Means for Schools and Businesses, Katie Reilly).

One of the classes that has come under attack is Advance Placement African American Studies, a class that examines not only history, but how this particular group has helped advance the worlds of science, literature, music, art, and so many more aspects of our daily lives. Opponents to this policy say it is important that people learn about these subjects because it shows students a wider historical look of the culture we have today.

Some examples of how a gender studies class could educate students are subtopics such as how gender identifies us, the intersection of gender and sexuality, and

how gender norms and sociopolitical structures influence populations. This class can help students understand the different ways that worldwide cultures view gender roles and identities. It can also give insight into the ways American culture examines and expresses gender.

The prime example and focus of DeSantis’ controversial act is the topic of critical race theory. CRT is an ideology that examines race as a social construct, and that racism is not only a product of individual bias or prejudice, but something that is embedded in legal systems and policies. DeSantis and Republicans claim that, on some level, classes that include these ideas encourage students to view America’s history as all negative, when in fact they bring light to how the government and society has treated minori-

ty groups. An example of this wrongdoing is “...in the 1930s, government officials...drew lines around areas deemed poor financial risks, often explicitly due to the racial composition of inhabitants.” (EdWeek, What is Critical Race Theory, and Why Is It Under Attack?, Stephen Sawchuk). Everyone everywhere should learn about what used to happen or it could still happen today. It’s the same as learning about the industrial revolution, or the Declaration of Independence, or the roaring 20s.

DeSantis’ opposition believes that minority groups shouldn’t be ignored in education, school is meant to create citizens who are open minded and educated. Education is a place to teach others about the world, to prepare them for the future and make them aware of our history.

This new law is called “SB 254”, it was filed on March 3rd, 2023. It was passed and approved by the Senate April 4th, 2023. The Senate voted 27-12. SB 254 had been sent to the House for their decision on April 5th, 2023 and was

passed into law.

Statistics from the years 2017 to 2020 show that 1.4% of 13 to 17-year-olds identify as transgender in the United States alone. In Florida the transgender population is 0.55%. This percentage will continue to increase over time across the US and in Florida. Out of the whole transgender population teens from 13 to 17 make up 18%. In a global survey conducted in 2021, 2% of respondents throughout 27 states identified as transgender. Each year the transgender population increases and the younger generations are losing the right to healthcare for their gender affirming needs.

A student who would like to stay anonymous said, “the way the law makes me feel is that he

[DeSantis] does not care for the trans youth of this country. It will be extremely detrimental to my mental health. It could lead to the suicides of thousands of [trans] children.” With this law being passed it has already caused anxiety throughout the community. People in Florida who are over the age of 18 and have already started their transitions and few minors who have done the same are safe from this law impacting them.

The Effects of School Shootings

School shootings are tragic and devastating events that have become far too common in the US. In recent years, there have been numerous school shootings across the country, resulting in an unaccountable amount of deaths and injuries.

Based on the graph from the Center for Homeland Defense and Security, in the year 2021 was the peak of school shootings at 240 shootings that year itself. One of the most recent shootings was the incident in Nashville, this shooting left three adults and three nine year olds dead. The shooter Audrey Hale, 28, shot through the glass doors of the school and walked in as easy as can be.

How does this keep the student safe? These tragic events have left communities shattered

and filled with grief, and they have sparked a national debate on gun control and school safety. School shootings are usually perpetrated by teenagers or young adults who are either current or former students at the school. These shooters are often struggling with mental health issues, and they may have easy access to guns, either through family members or on the streets.

In some cases, the perpetrators of school shootings have targeted certain groups, such as

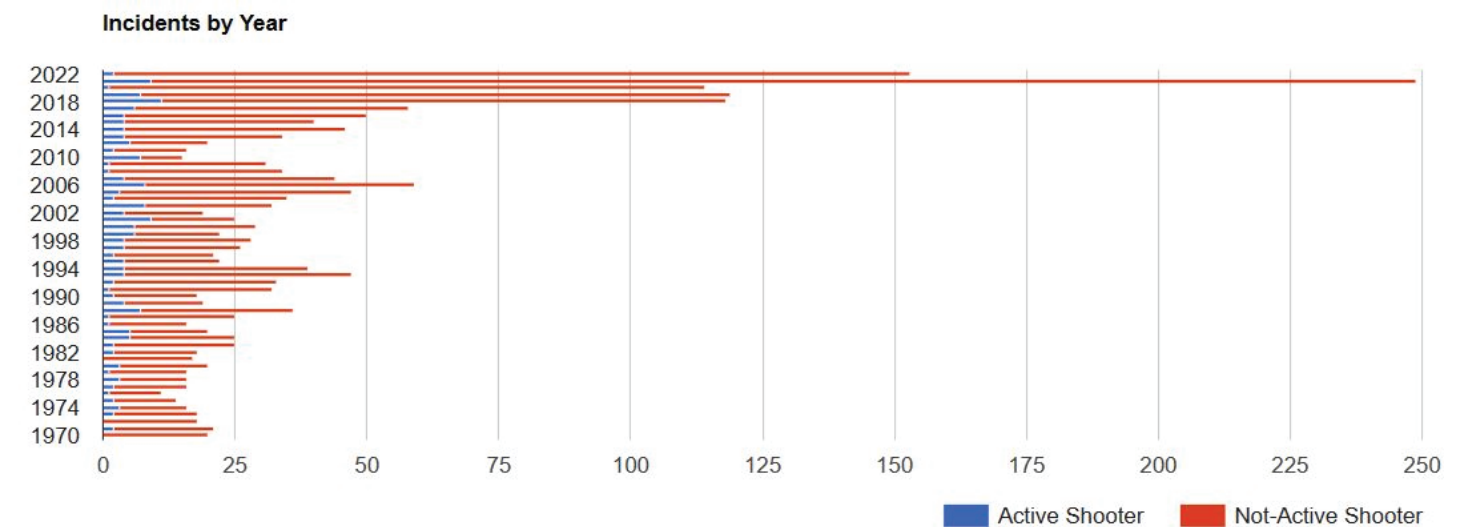
those of a certain race or religion. But still at the end of the day even with all of that information is a shooter taking another students life justifiable.

Ms. Johnson in Guidance says “it’s not justifiable at all because in the event that you have other things going on at home it still should not compel you to want to take the life of others that have absolutely no connection to your situation”

The effects of a school

shooting can be devastating and long lasting. In addition to the deaths and injuries that occur, the trauma experienced by survivors and witnesses can be severe.

Although school shootings are getting out of hand governor Ron DeSantis has loosened gun control even more. On Monday April 3rd the laws to carry a gun now allows any person to carry a gun without a permit or training in Florida.



Substance Legalization and its Trail of Problems

In recent years, there has been a spike of incidents of students having drugs or other substances on their persons while at school. This issue is brought to our attention by the fact that within the recent years, marijuana has gained legalization in many different states, and while it is illegal to smoke recreationally in Florida, you can obtain your medical marijuana card for health reasons.

In the state of Florida, gaining a medical card for your health is allowed by the law. But smoking in public places without one can make you end up with a felony. With this rising interest in smoking, the number of minors addicted to drugs has risen drastically. In Florida alone, according to drugabusestatistics.org, states that 3.1% of 12–17-year-olds have an illicit drug use disorder. Another statistic states that around 7.87% of teens currently use drugs. Also, studies have shown that in the city of Saint, Petersburg around 15% of the adolescent population have used illicit drugs.

Even our own school is having continuous problems with kids getting caught with substances that they either purchased or took from their parent’s “secret” stash. The problem has gotten so out of hand that kids are now coming to school while under the influence of drugs. This can have a huge impact on the student’s overall performance in and out of the classroom. I interviewed School resource offi-

cer Pam, Settle about what measures have been taken by NEHI to address the issue of drug use among students and she shared that “If students are found using drugs the student and the parents are required to go to a program called Face-It which can show both the students and parents the dangers of using illicit drugs”. She also stated that “there are also multiple community resources available to help students who are struggling with drug use such as the Face-It program, and the NOPE program”. Having all of these programs can definitely decrease the number of students who are currently using or trying to stop using illicit drugs which will help benefit them in the future.

The increasing problem of students bringing drugs or other substances to school has been caused by multiple states such as Florida legalizing marijuana. With the legalization of Marijuana teens are getting more and more addicted to this drug because it is so easy to get. Weather its getting it from a friend or taking out of a parent’s drawer this problem is definitely getting out of hand. Nevertheless, the city of St. Petersburg has created multiple counseling programs which were created to help teens who suffer from drug use. NEHI has also been working on the problem of teens using drugs on campus and based off of the decrease in the amount of teens getting caught it shows that the security and the new enforcement of rules has finally been working.

The Willow Project

A massively destructive oil production plan called the Willow Project has recently been approved by the Biden administration. Backlash has come alongside this bill because its environmental impact has the potential to be devastating to our planet.

There is not much that can be done to stop it now that it has been approved, but it is still important to understand exactly what this project will entail and what damage will follow. The Willow Project will involve drilling into Alaska’s North Slope in the National Petroleum Reserve. Predicted to be extensive, the mission will take up to 30 years.

The area where they are drilling contains up to 600 million barrels of oil, which will result in about 160,000 barrels of oil every single day. The drilling will cause irreparable damage to the environment.

According to projections done by the Biden administration itself, the drilling will generate enough oil to release 9.2 million metric tons of carbon pollution every year. For reference, this is the equivalent of adding 2 million gas powered cars to the roads.

This project, when completed, will account for up to a third of emissions created from coal plants across the country. Not only will this plan create its own emissions, but it also has the capability of triggering gas leaks that will cascade into even more environmental problems. There has been resistance to this brought by activists, natives to the Alaskan land, and others.

As soon as the terms of the bill were released, activists took to social media and encouraged actions such as sending letters to the White House as well as signing petitions on Change.org. These attempts to raise awareness were successful; one million letters were sent to the Biden administration and 2.8 signatures were signed on a Change.org petition, but to no avail. If people had been educated about this situation earlier on, maybe something could’ve been done to stop it.

“We [as teachers] constantly have to show the students how we must be stewards of this planet,” said middle school environmental science teacher Paula Godfrey. She believes that we won’t have to tell the upcoming generation about the Willow Project because they will see the effects of it for themselves.

“I know we normally think that if it’s out of sight, it’s out of mind. But this will ultimately impact us greatly.”

Just as she said, future generations will most definitely see the effects of this project in their everyday lives. Our ecosystem will be disrupted and it will show.

“I can say that I have seen many beautiful things in my life so far. . . those experiences have changed my view of the world and the beauty of nature, and I am afraid that my children may not have the life changing experiences that I have been presented with,” says 11th grade student Lexi Baum.

This is a very real fear; many are worried that their children will grow up in a world vastly different from ours. Now that the Willow Project has been put into action, only time will tell.

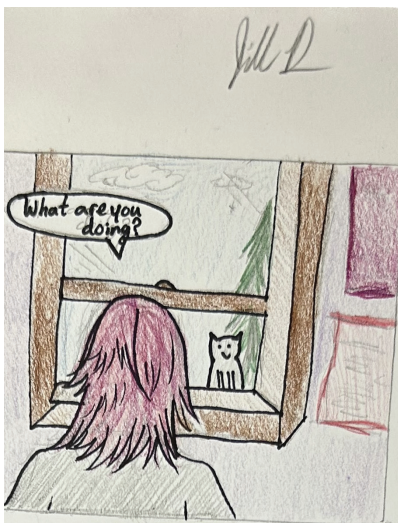
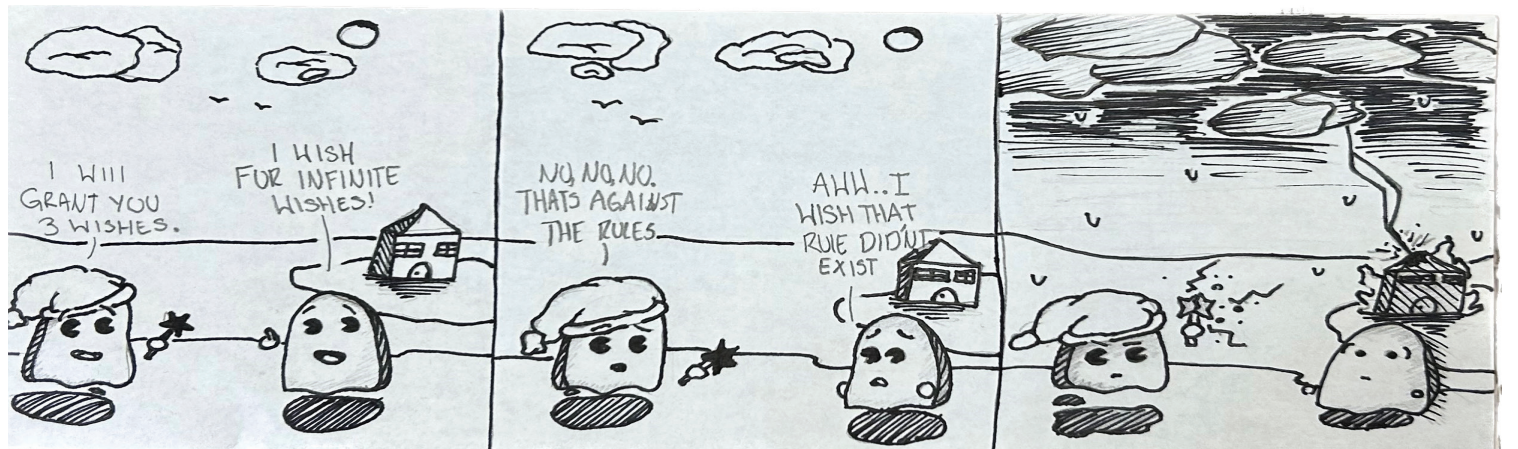
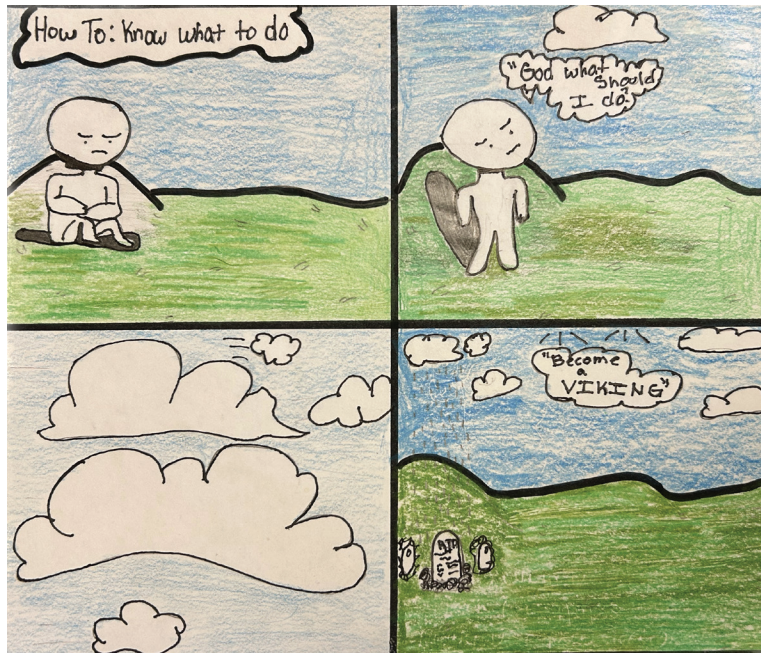
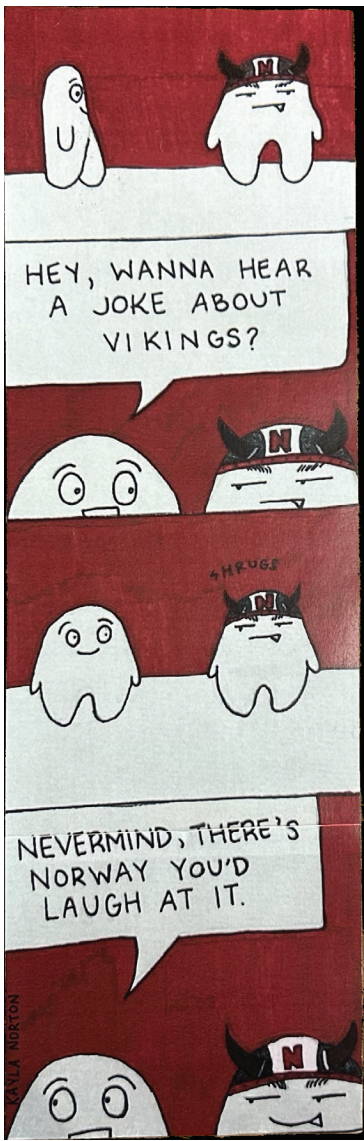
The app is questionable. Temu sells things like running shoes, Universal wrenchers, talking toys along with bags that are very low prices. And when customers get people to sign up they receive credit.

Temu has a 1.4 average customer rating. They have responded to customers complaints but most remain unsolved.



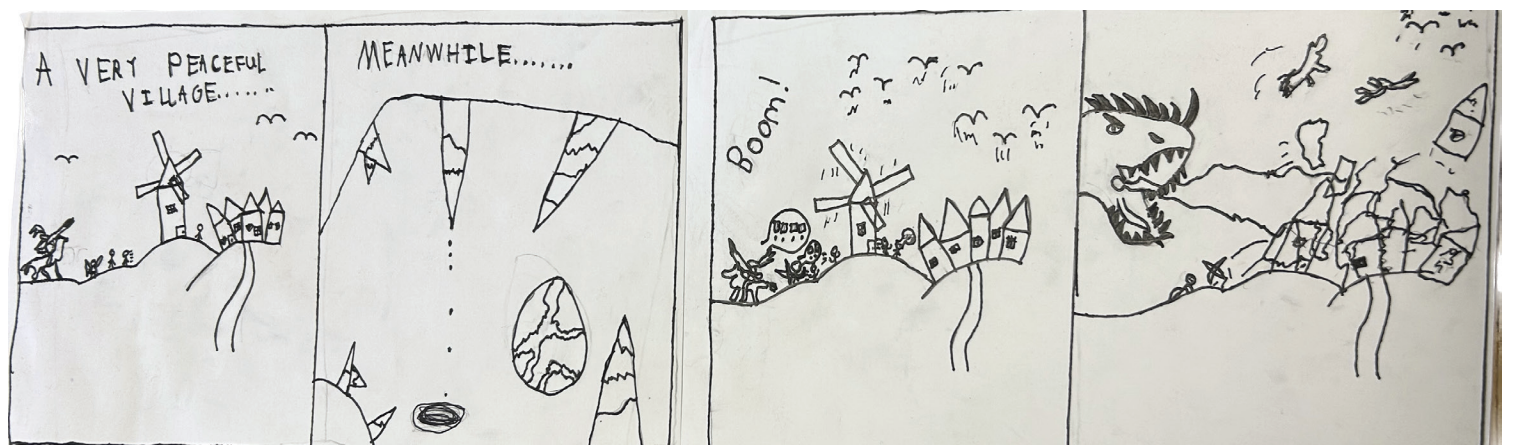
