


















- 24 Credit Option
 - 4 credits in English
 - 4 credits in Math
 - Algebra 1
 - Geometry
 - 3 credits in Science
 - Biology
 - 3 credits in Social Studies
 - ½ US Government
 - World History
 - US History
 - ½ Economics
 - 1 credit in Fine or Performing Arts, Speech and Debate, or Career and Technical Education
 - 1 credit in HOPE (or 2 years of a varsity sport)
 - o 1/2 credit in Personal Financial Literacy
 - 7.5 credits in Electives
- Passing score on the Algebra 1 EOC or Concordant Score on PSAT, ACT, SAT or Geometry EOC
- Passing score on Grade 10 PM3 or Concordant Score on SAT or ACT

Florida Graduation Requirements

- All Cougars must participate in EOC assessments for the following courses
 - Algebra 1
 - Biology 1
 - Geometry
 - US History
- EOC is 30% of overall grade for the course
