All About Title I


Title I is the **largest** federal assistance program for our nation's schools.

The program serves **99** schools in Pinellas County including eligible students in **39** non-public schools.

The Title I goal is that **every** student achieves **high** levels of academic proficiency.

Proficiency

Academic Area	2021-2022	2022-2023	2023-2024
ELA	61%	59%	67%
MATH	68%	69%	68%
SCIENCE	54%	67%	73%
Overall Percent	55%	65%	63%

- Proficiency in ELA will increase from 67% to 73%
- Proficiency in Math will increase from 68% to 73%
- Proficiency in Science will increase from 73% to 75%

Instructional Materials/ Student Supplies - \$40,000






