



2023-2024 School Grade Highlights

- Improvement in all core academic areas for proficiency and learning gains.
- Social Studies & Science proficiency saw double digit gains from last year (Bio. – 11 points, S.S. – 16 points).

School-Wide Instructional Strategies

BCHS will increase rigor school-wide by:

- 1. Implementing Complex Collaborative Structures to enhance student understanding of rigorous content through discussion and writing (Philosophical Chairs, Socratic Seminars, Collaborative Study Groups, etc.).
- 2. Monitoring the learning with feedback to assess student understanding and modify instruction accordingly (Gallery Walk, 3-2-1, Think-Write-Pair-Share).
- 3. **Planning Comprehensive Instruction** bell-to-bell (Sailing for 90 Minutes) utilizing Pirate Path AVID WICOR strategies during the 10-minute wrap-up (reflections, summaries, revising notes, exit tickets, etc.).


After School Free Tutoring




