

PREPARING FOR HIGH SCHOOL

SOON YOU WILL BE APPLYING TO HIGH SCHOOLS

- 8TH GRADE STUDENTS WILL HAVE MEETING WITH THEIR SCHOOL COUNSELOR TO RECEIVE THE ELECTIVE COURSE INFORMATION FOR THEIR ASSIGNED HIGH SCHOOL.
- STUDENTS WILL HAVE A "CARD CARRYING DAY" IN WHICH THEY RECEIVE ACADEMIC FEEDBACK BY THEIR TEACHERS AS TO WHICH COURSES MAY BE APPROPRIATE FOR 9TH GRADE.
- HIGH SCHOOLS WILL HAVE A SPECIFIC NIGHT TIME REGISTRATION FOR FAMILIES TO ATTEND AND REGISTER STUDENTS FOR HIGH SCHOOL. (FEB/MARCH)
- SHADOWING WILL BE AVAILABLE





LOOKING AHEAD

24 credits for graduation

16 core curriculum credits:

4 credits in English

4 credits in Mathematics

(including Algebra I, Geometry I or higher)

3 credits in Science, two of which must have a laboratory component (one credit must be in Biology I or higher)

3 credits in Social studies

(1 World History, 1 American History, .5 American Government, and .5 Economics with Financial **Literacy**)

1 credit in Fine, Performing, or Practical Arts

1 credit in Physical Education to include the integration of Health (Called HOPE)
** 1 online course (can be an elective or academic course)**



8-12 ELECTIVE CREDITS



These credits may be combined to allow for:

- foreign language requirements for college admission (minimum 2 years, now 3 years encouraged)
- magnet or academy courses
- an area of interest that results in certification
- fun elective courses
- intensive reading or mathematics intervention courses
