<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Serves as consultant and support to School-Based Intervention Team. • Assists school teams in reviewing and interpreting results of universal screenings. • Reviews individual student records as needed. • Assists school teams in identifying students in need of tier 2 and 3 interventions. • Demonstrates working knowledge of current curriculum. • Demonstrates thorough knowledge of research-based interventions and is able to select appropriate interventions to address student deficits. • Participates in problem-solving within a multi-tiered system of supports. • Administers and interprets progress monitoring to determine students' response to intervention. • Displays progress monitoring data in graphic formats. • Assists school teams in following students' progress and recommending changes in types or intensity of interventions. • May conduct classroom observations to assist in supporting teachers in student assessment, progress monitoring and intervention integrity. • Demonstrates working knowledge of differentiated instruction. • May participate in parent conferences, 504 plan meetings, eligibility determination and IEP meetings. • Conducts formal and informal training with school staff related to assessment, interventions, progress monitoring and data driven decision making. • Conducts individual student evaluations to analyze academic skills. • Completes reports interpreting evaluation results. • Collects and submits data on services provided to students and schools. • Pursues own professional development related to improving student achievement. • Performs other related duties as assigned.
