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| SCHOOL SAFETY SPECIALIST |
| REPORTS TO: Chief Operations Officer |
| SUPERVISES: Support Staff |
| QUALIFICATIONS: Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university or served in the capacity of Lieutenant or similar position in law enforcement or military. Three (3) years of school-based administrative, law enforcement officer or military experience. Must earn a certificate of completion of the school safety specialist training provided by the Office of Safe Schools within one (1) year after appointment. |
| PREFERRED: Master's degree from an accredited college or university. Experience in administration of safety and security practices or programs in a school or law enforcement setting. |
| MAJOR FUNCTION |
| Provides operational oversight for the Safety and Security Department and oversees all emergency management planning and response for Pinellas County Schools. Represents the district to the national, state, and the local emergency management community. Provides training to school staff in all aspects of emergency management and critical incident response principles and procedures. Coordinates with the Chief Operations Officer and/or Chief of Schools Police to implement the initial district response to any crisis situation, emergency response, or disaster with a primary focus on protecting lives and property, stabilizing the situation or condition, and effecting transition to the crisis response team for the implementation of the system's crisis management protocols. Coordinates with the Chief Operations Officer and/or Chief of Schools Police to establish procedures for the prevention of violence on school grounds, including the assessment of and intervention with individuals whose behavior poses a threat to the safety of the school community. |
| ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Maintains all required certifications and training as prescribed by any changes in statutes.• Responsible for the oversight for all civilian school safety and security personnel, policies, and procedures in the school district.• Provides the necessary training and resources to students and school district staff in matters relating to assistance; emergency procedures, including active shooter training; and school safety and security.• Serves as a school district liaison with local public safety agencies and national, state, and community agencies and organizations in matters of school safety and security.• Oversees the schools' security risk assessments in accordance with state law at each public school using the school security risk assessment tool developed by the Office of Safe Schools.• Uses the Safety and Security Best Practices developed by the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability to conduct a self-assessment of the school districts' current safety and security practices.• Provides recommendations to the School Board which identify strategies and activities that should be implemented to improve school safety and security.• Ensures schools and the district are in compliance with all rules and statutes related to school safety.• Reports schools not in compliance to the Chief Operations Officer or Office of Safe Schools as appropriate. |

SCHOOL SAFETY SPECIALIST

ESSENTIAL RESPONSIBILITIES (Continued)

- Coordinates with appropriate public safety agencies designated as first responders to a school's campus to conduct a tour of such campus once every three (3) years and provides recommendations related to school safety.
- Assists in aligning the department's mission and goals to the district's strategic plan.
- Administers and communicates the district's school safety and security efforts/programs.
- Implements emergency response plans and related initiatives in accordance with national, state, and local emergency preparedness and critical incident response requirements and standards.
- Oversees the creation and management of a school safety and security database and utilizes the data to modify programs and services and prepares recommendations for the Chief Operations Officer.
- Consults with school and district administrators on safety issues related to curriculum, field trips, and school-based programs.
- Ensures compliance with federal and state regulations and district policies and procedures as a member of the District Safety and Security Council.
- Communicates with school and community groups on issues related to school safety.
- Ensures emergency shelters are appropriately staffed during activation.
- Ensures district compliance with the National Incident Management System (NIMS).
- Supervises the selection, development, and evaluation of departmental personnel.
- Researches latest trends and developments in emergency management, safety, and security.
- Communicates effectively, orally and in writing, with other professionals, students, parents, and community.
- Performs other related duties as assigned.

TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT

Salary and benefits shall be paid consistent with the district's approved compensation plan. Length of the work year and hours of employment shall be established by the District.

Performance of the job will be evaluated in accordance with provisions of the School Board's policy on evaluation of personnel.
