Kyle Bell: Kyle Bell graduated from Osceola in 2010 after four years of pursuing an education in video production and sports marketing. Kyle went on to St. Petersburg College to earn an Associate Degree in Communications and a Bachelor of Science in Technology Management and Cybersecurity. Kyle is a versatile multimedia specialist with over a decade of experience creating and producing marketing videos and live event production. He currently serves as the Multimedia Coordinator at Pinellas County Schools, where he is responsible for supporting events

throughout the school district and creating engaging video content for marketing

In addition to his work at Pinellas County Schools, Kyle is a Game Day graphics operator for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and an experienced video engineer at Command Corp. He had also set the State record in wrestling with 26 pins. Calvin was the first individual State

champion in any sport in Osceola history.

After graduating from Osceola, Calvin received a full ride scholarship to Virginia Union University, where he played football and started on the offensive line as a freshman. After college in 1988, he began his career at Admiral Farragut Academy. He started out in the Mess Hall and served in that role for 13 years. Because of the close bonds he created with the students, Calvin was invited to work as the Faculty on Duty in the dormitory. For over 30 years he has worked in Residential Life, and he now also holds the role of Transportation Coordinator. For many years, Calvin was the Wrestling Coach and produced several wrestling champions. His staff will tell you that he does just about everything for the school and for the students!

While Calvin did not have kids of his own, he has devoted his life to every student who steps through the doors at Admiral Farragut Academy, and he considers all his boarding students as one of his own. 

She was a four-time cross country State qualifier, with a career best time in the 5k of 18:53. On the track, Alexis held the school record in the 800m with 2:14, 1600m with 5:07, and 3200m with 11:32. During her senior track season, she qualified for the State meet in the 800m, and placed with a runner up

finish on her soon to be home track, the University of North Florida.

Alexis received a full scholarship to run cross country and indoor/outdoor track at UNF, and raced competitively all four years. In 2012, she received Atlantic Sun All-Freshman Cross Country honors, and 2014-2016 received Atlantic Sun Academic Honor Roll. Her most prized accolade was meeting fellow Osprey, and now husband Kosta Fotopoulos who ran track and cross country at Countryside High School.

Her favorite sport became basketball, and she was the team MVP for all three years she played on varsity.

She retired with school records for most total points (1,843 in just 3 seasons), most points in a season (695), and most points in a single game (42). In her last two years, against very strong competition, she led the Warriors to heights such as District Runner-Up, Conference Runner-Up, and #6 in the state while the #1 team in the district and PCAC won state championships.

Kathy became the first member of her family to ever graduate high school and then became the first to attend college. She earned a two-year degree while playing at what is now Seminole State College in Sanford, Florida. She returned to Pinellas and began a career in childcare. When her high school basketball coach, Tom Shaneyfelt, became the varsity coach at Clearwater High School, Kathy joined him as the JV and varsity assistant coach. This resulted in their being together for a successful 20-year coaching run with Kathy's JV teams winning over 80% of their games. Her invaluable contributions helped the varsity team achieve a 508-113

record with 17 District titles, 9 Conference titles, 8 Final Four appearances, and 3 State Runners-Up finishes.
