

Florida Bright Futures



> Students who receive their IB diploma (based on exams taken prior to high school graduation) receive top level of Bright Futures = 100% tuition and fees paid for by the state

➤ We strongly encourage students to volunteer during 9th and 10th grade for Bright Futures, but it is not a requirement. If for some reason a student does not complete the IB curriculum, we hope that we have provided them with an opportunity to begin/finish their Bright Futures volunteer hours with us and not leave empty-handed!

College Credits and More

- IB students have the opportunity to earn up to 45 college credits
- This allows students to take more electives in college, double major, graduate early, and/or participate in early Masters programs
- By taking college level courses in high school, colleges can be confident students are prepared for college success and this weighs in the acceptance process
- IB students are more likely to be admitted to Honors Programs

Florida State University IB Scholarship

IB Diploma Scholarship

This scholarship recognizes students who have demonstrated exceptional academic performance by completing the rigorous and internationally recognized International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program.

Applicants are automatically considered for the IB Diploma Scholarship. A separate application is not required. The Florida State University's total value of the award is \$8,000, which will be distributed throughout eight semesters in \$1,000 increments at the beginning of each fall and spring term. This scholarship would be in addition to any other merit-based awards offered at the time of admission and the Bright Futures Scholarship awarded to qualifying Florida residents.

For more information, please visit our **renewal requirements page**. Scholarship funds are limited, so students are encouraged to apply for admission by December 1.

Only first-year applicants admitted to the Tallahassee Main Campus for the summer or fall term are eligible for this award.
