


Explanation Choice 'B', functionalism, is correct This approach, popular in the 1880s through the early 1900s, felt that it was next to impossible to really capture what people were thinking, feeling, or sensing because consciousness was a steady stream, not a collection of individual thoughts. They were also inspired by the ideas of evolution, which suggested that all behavior has a purpose. Explanation of Distractors The most direct opposite is Choice 'A', structuralism, which does want to understand what thoughts are "made of". If a functionalist was studying cars, she would focus on driving them, while a structuralist would take them apart. Choice 'C', gestalt psych, was a German approach that looked at how the mind pulled together pieces of information into a whole. Choice 'D', dualism, is a philosophic position that the body and mind are separate things. Psychoanalysis, Choice 'E', is Freud's general approach of looking for unconscious motivations to explain and help an individual.

- August-September: prep for PSAT
 - Explore college websites
- October: Take PSAT
 - Attend college info sessions
- November-December: Investigate scholarships
 - Sign up for SAT/ACT
 - Study for SAT
 - Investigate financial aid
- January-February: begin application for military service academies
- March: In-school SAT

- March-April-May: Schedule college visits during spring break
 - Continue to investigate scholarships
 - Continue to research colleges
 - Ask teachers for letters of recommendation (one or two)
- Summer between Junior and Senior Years: Explore/research colleges of interest online/visit
 - Narrow your list of colleges according to "fit"
 - Write a rough draft of your Common Application essay
 - Research financial aid







The IB Core - TOK

An interdisciplinary course that examines the nature of knowledge and the human capacity for thought and understanding

Critical is questioning how one knows what one claims to know; how does one properly justify that which is believed true

Students challenge their own held notions and underlying (unquestioned) assumptions

Address knowledge issues (AOKs)

TOK Exhibition – assesses
the ability of the student to
show how TOK manifests in
the world around us.
Completed Junior Year

TOK Essay – students explore TOK in one of the six given titles. Completed Senior Year

TOK assessments are neither an essay nor a report on a topic. Students must deeply examine the "Knowledge Questions."

The IB Core - EE



Academic Research in chosen area. Students submit top three choices.



Independent Investigation carried out at home or in school lab (biology)



Reasoned examination of an intellectual nature in which established sources of academic merit are assessed and applied in the creation of authentic writing



Advisors have three meetings with students. Heavy focus in Q4 on EE. Due 1st day of Senior year. Done at this time due to college applications.
