
- Title I is the **largest** federal assistance program for our nation's schools.

The budget covers our part-time hourly teachers, extended learning programs, paraprofessionals, substitutes, family engagement plans and instructional materials and supplies.



#### Area of Focus

During the 2023 - 2024 school year, 18% of students were absent 10% or more, the average daily attendance was 93.4%.

#### Goal

During the 2024-2025 school year, the percentage of students who are absent 10% or more will decrease to 15%, and the average daily attendance will increase to 95%.

#### **Action Steps**

- Training to staff during school-wide PLC.
- Implement attendance recognition.
- CST will monitor and share attendance progress.
