# Menu for Summer Reading

Based on your summer reading novel, 1984 by George Orwell, complete the following:

Choose one appetizer or one dessert. You must order the entrée!! Assignments can be completed digitally or on paper. Handwritten assignments must be legible, or neatly written to be graded. Remember to include your name, period #, due date: <u>August 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024</u>. If you choose to type your work, remember to use size 12 font, Calibri(body) Font, and double-space written assignments. \*Upload digital work directly to Canvas, please!

#### Appetizers (25 points)

Write a **well-developed paragraph** providing a **new title** for the novel and provide a well-reasoned description as to why the new title is appropriate. Use text evidence to support your reasoning 8-14 complete sentences.

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Design a **personality collage** for one of the characters containing adjectives, questions, quotes and images/illustrations on an 8.5 x 11 white sheet of paper.

or

Create a **Freytag Model** (plot <u>diagram</u>) for the novel. Include a quote and a page number for each plot element, along **with** an **image** for each. \*Include the background information, rising action, climax, falling action & resolution. Additionally, provide one major conflict and the point-of-view.

## Entree \*Required (50 points)

**Write an analytical paragraph analyzing one universal theme in the novel.** Use at least 3 specific examples from the text, cite page numbers, organize ideas chronologically, provide context for the evidence, and elaboration to support reasoning. Remember to include the <u>title</u>, author, and genre in your topic sentence, as well as a concluding sentence to wrap up the purpose of the paragraph.

## **Dessert** (25 points)

**Design an acrostic poem for your favorite character.** Use character traits for each letter of his or her name. List at least two quotes from the story to support the traits you chose and cite the page number(s).

or

Design an **advertisement** for the story that encourages your classmates to read it. Your understanding of the text should be evident through a creative demonstration that is truly intriguing to young readers. You must include at least 2 relevant cited pieces of text.

Create a **news report** that explains the resolution. Provide pertinent information including names, locations, and other relevant details. It should be a minimum of 14 sentences.

or

Consider the theme, characters, plot of the story. **Create a picture book** that uses the same theme, characters, or plot. Do not just retell the story, make it creative.
