#### A MESSAGE FROM THE SOCIAL WORKER

Dear Families,

My name is Ilona Sakovich, and I am the new School Social Worker at Pinellas Central Elementary. Parents often ask me what does a social worker do in a school setting? As a social worker, I wear many hats - I am a member of multidisciplinary team that addresses Exceptional Student Education for Children with Disabilities, I also monitor Functional Behavioral Assessments for students, provide individual and group counseling, work with homeless families and families in need, and more. I am also a member of CST, the school's Child's Study Team that addresses students' attendance. As we all know, consistent attendance is a key to the scholars' academic success.

I also would like you to be aware of the process that takes place if a student does not attend school regularly. How do we monitor each student's attendance in school? A student is considered to be truant by law when the student has:

- \*5 unexcused absences in a 30-day period or
- \*10 unexcused days in a 90-day period
- \*a student with 10% or more absences during a particular school year is a concern
- \*numerous tardies

What happens next? The school's Child Study Team reaches out to the parent in attempt to improve attendance. In case of no improvement, the student is referred to The State Attorney's Office Truancy Intervention Program (TIP), which is an early intervention program aimed at reducing truancy at the elementary school level in Pinellas and Pasco counties. TIP is a collaborative effort between the Office of the State Attorney, the School Board of Pinellas County, the Department of Juvenile Justice, and Family Resources, Inc. In the event when parents do not comply with the program, the case may be referred for prosecution for Educational Neglect and a criminal prosecution against the student's parent can be initiated.

What consequences can a parent face due to a child's truancy? A parent who refuses or fails to have a minor student who is under his or her control attend school regularly, or who refuses or fails to comply with the requirements in subsection (3), commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, by a fine or a term of imprisonment not exceeding 60 days.

What can you do to prevent this from happening? Make sure your scholar attends school regularly! Please report all absences through the school website and obtain doctor's notes when possible - excused absences don't count in the truancy process. Feel free to speak with your student's teacher or school counselor or school social worker about frequent absences, and don't hesitate to ask for help. We are here for you and your scholar!
