East Lake High School Spanish Honor Society submitted by Sally Zepeda

The Octavio Paz Chapter of Spanish National Honor Society at East Lake High donated a pair of llamas from Heifer International to be given to a needy family in the highlands of Peru in memory of Pamela Urdal Silva. In the Andes inbreeding among the llamas was causing the herds to decrease in size each year. There was also a problem of overgrazing. Heifer International gave training sessions to the Aymara people, teaching them to restore the environment by planting native fodder grasses and improving the llama breeding practices. The llama wool is used to make clothing, blankets, carpets and rope. Besides filling the needs of the family, any excess products can be sold or used to barter to improve the quality of their lives. The Aymara do not waste any part of the llama. They collect the dung and dry it for fuel or use it for fertilizer. A low income family living at barely subsistence level can be greatly impacted by the gift of a pair of llamas. This often translates into healthier and better educated children. Chapter members held a carwash at the Chick-fil-A in Oldsmar to raise money for the llamas. A pair of llamas costs \$300. One member, "Chela" Bowan, talked the manager into letting her wear the cow outfit to flag people down for the event. We chose to donate the pair of llamas in memory of Pamela Urdal Silva, a founding teacher here at East Lake and also the founder of our Spanish National Honor Society. She passed away in August of 2004 after a courageous ten year battle against cancer. Profe Silva loved to travel, and one of her last extensive trips was to the Andes. It was the trip of a lifetime for her! Her doctor temporarily suspended her chemo so that she could go. Profe would love that we had a hand in helping to make an Andean family self sufficient in her name.
