ELECTRICIAN

MAJOR FUNCTION:

Performs semi-skilled work in assisting in the installation, repair, and maintenance of a variety of electrical systems and equipment. Assists Electrician-Journeyman in most projects to learn all phases of the job. Work is performed under direct supervision and is reviewed in progress and upon completion.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Assists Electrician-Journeyman in installation, alterations, maintenance, and repair of wiring systems, switch panels, flood lights, ornamental lights, and other electrical fixtures.
- In performance of duties, learns how to skillfully use electric tools and equipment such as voltmeters, ammeters, and power factor meters.
- Applies knowledge of standard methods, practices, tools, and materials of electrical trade; of the National Electric Code; and of hazards and safety precautions of the trade.
- Reads simple diagrams and blueprints.
- Performs heavy lifting on a routine basis.
- Performs related work as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

Graduation from high school or possession of a GED, plus two (2) years experience in the electrical trade, performing most of the above mentioned duties and responsibilities. The successful completion of up to two (2) years of verifiable formal training in the trade (vocational, military, or indentured apprentice school) may be substituted for a like amount of the experience requirement. Possession of a valid State of Florida Class E noncommercial driver's license, and any other license as may be required by law.
