**EQUIPMENT REPAIR MECHANIC – JOURNEYMAN**

**MAJOR FUNCTION:**

Performs skilled work maintaining and repairing defective parts and equipment primarily associated with vocational training and physical education. Leads and trains subordinates in a full range of mechanical operations. Work is performed with much independence and reviewed upon completion for conformance with prescribed standards.

**DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- Maintains and repairs a variety of hand held and floor model machinery, such as saws, sanders, grinders, drills and drill presses, lathes, power surfacers, and dust collectors; installs, and adjusts new equipment, orders parts and replacement items.
- Inspects equipment periodically to determine future service needs and machine life; conducts safety inspections on safety guards and related items.
- Applies knowledge of standard practices, methods, tools, and materials of machinist trade; of occupational hazards of general maintenance operations; knowledge of welding, machine work, and related mechanical trades operations; follows technical instructions and diagrams.
- Lifts heavy items on a routine basis.
- Performs related work as required.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:**

Ability to follow written instructions and two (2) years progressively responsible experience in mechanical repair and installation, or an equivalent combination of training and experience. Possession of a valid State of Florida Class E noncommercial driver's license.
