

School Agenda Planners

School Agenda Planners are a vital part of home and school communication and are required for all students. Please be sure to check your child's agenda planner and sign it daily.

Fact Frenzy Friday

Each Friday, students in grades 2-5 will take a brief Math Facts assessment. In order for students to engage in more complex math, it is important that they master their math facts with a high level of automaticity. Parents will be kept informed of their child's progress as they master these important foundational skills.

Reading and Accelerated Reader

One aspect of our School Wide Reading Program is for the students to read each night 45 minutes for Grades 3-5 and 30 minutes grades K-2.

After students read a book or have a book read to them, they take an Accelerated Reader test to earn Accelerated Reader points.

Our FAST PM1 District Testing Windows have arrived and are below. Letters went home sharing more information about this test. Classroom teachers will share the exact dates in which your child will test as the dates near.

- PK/VPK: August 25 September 12
- Grades K-2: August 25 September 26
- Grades 3-5: September 3 September 26

Your student's results from PM1 are for informational purposes only, and you will be provided with information about how to access the results after testing is completed.

FAST assessments are computer-adaptive tests taken on a computer or tablet. The questions get easier or more difficult depending on how the student responds, and each student will see different questions from a common item bank. For more information on the test design, please visit

https://www.fldoe.org/accountability/assessments/k-12-student-assessment/best/. If you or your student would like to interact with the online testing platform or review FAST ELA Reading and Mathematics sample items at home, sample test materials are available at https://flfast.org/families.html. Families will receive a letter stating how to access results once your child has completed testing. Please sign and return the bottom portion of the letter stating you have received the directions.

Fall in Love with Reading: Ten Simple Things you Can Do at Home - Part 1

There are many ways to enjoy reading with your child. Here are a few ways to make reading a fun part of your everyday life.

1. Develop family reading routines and rituals.

Find a regular time of day when you can dedicate story time into your day. You can read in the morning, after school, or before bedtime! Making story time a cozy routine makes reading an essential and pleasant activity.

2. Read what interests your child.

The nutrition facts on the milk box, newspapers, recipes, maps, and game instructions all make great reading material if your child is interested.

3. Try books that reflect your daily experiences.

Making connections to topics you read about is a fun way to keep children engaged. For example, you can read *You Can't Take a Balloon into the Metropolitan Museum* with your child before or after visiting an art museum. This opens up opportunities for conversations like discussing similarities and differences between the book and the museum visit.

4. Let your child select books.

When you visit the library, let your child select books. Try both fiction and informational books, and ask the librarian for recommendations based on your child's interests.

5. Reread your child's favorites.

It's common for young children to request the same book again and again. Re-reading familiar stories offers children a chance to absorb information over time and lets them master the whole story.

PE Shorts
