

To facilitate excellence in learning and achievement through acquisition, alignment, and administration of supplemental fiscal resources

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SPECIAL PROJECTS OFFICE

The Special Projects office is responsible for ensuring the school district maximizes opportunities to access and leverage various grants made available through federal, state, local, corporate or private sources. The Special Projects Director assists with coordination, integration, and alignment of services across federal and state education grant programs. Additionally, the Director maintains information regarding existing and pending legislation specific to grants, communicates pertinent information to appropriate school district personnel, monitors budgetary expenditures, guarantees local commitments, facilitates submission of reports, serves as grants liaison for eligible non-public schools, and maintains documentation for audit purposes. The district's Grant Developers research and disseminate information about grants for which the district and/or schools meet eligibility requirements, provide technical assistance for the development of competitive proposals and grant-funded contracts, assist with the creation of logic models and timelines for grant proposals, and provide guidance for selection of external evaluators.

SPECIAL PROJECTS ANNUAL REPORT

This report has been prepared to detail supplemental fiscal resources and programs that were awarded to the Pinellas County School District, in support of the district's strategic directions, for the period of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020.
