

SPECIAL PROJECTS OFFICE

The Special Projects office is responsible for ensuring the school district maximizes opportunities to access and leverage various grants made available through federal, state, local, corporate or private sources. The Federal Programs Director assists with coordination, integration, and alignment of services across federal and state education grant programs. Additionally, the Director maintains information regarding existing and pending legislation specific to grants, communicates pertinent information to appropriate school district personnel, monitors budgetary expenditures, guarantees local commitments, facilitates submission of reports, serves as grants liaison for eligible non-public schools, and maintains documentation for audit purposes. The district's Grant Coordinators research and disseminate information about grants for which the district and/or schools meet eligibility requirements, provide technical assistance for the development of competitive proposals and grant-funded contracts, assist with the creation of logic models and timelines for grant proposals, and provide guidance for selection of external evaluators.

PROJECTS AND GRANTS

Grants are awarded directly to the district, while projects are awarded through another entity such as the Florida Department of Education. The projects and grants listed in this report were procured through application to a funding agency and coordinated through the Special Projects Office. Special Projects staff provided ongoing monitoring of activities, budget expenditures, completion of deliverables, and amendments, as needed. A project manager served as the primary contact to receive updates, technical assistance, and other guidance from the Federal Progams Director. All projects and grants are subject to annual review by the awarding agencies and/or external auditors.

SPECIAL PROJECTS ANNUAL REPORT

This report has been prepared to detail supplemental fiscal resources and programs that were awarded to the Pinellas County School District, in support of the district's strategic directions, for the period of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022.

This document provides pertinent information relative to each of the 72 projects and grants, funded in the total amount of **\$421,505,343.54**, through the activities and efforts of the Special Projects Office.
