This month we will focus on summarizing, which is telling the most important parts of a text in your own words.

According to Reading Rockets summarizing shows students how to discern the essential ideas in a text. how to ignore irrelevant information. and how to integrate the central ideas in a meaningful way. Summarizing also improves student's memories and act as a check for comprehension.

I have included a description of what is required from each grade level for summarizing a literary text and informational text. I have also included an example for both literary and informational that all grade levels can use to help with summarizing.

## LITERARY TEXT

- Summarizing a literary text for all grade levels includes the most important parts of a story.
- The 'somebody, wanted, but, so' chart is extremely helpful when determining the most important parts (see below).
- This chart helps students identify the main character, what they wanted, the problem, how they tried to solve it, and the actual solution.
- This is a great activity to start as it will support students in the upper grades when they have to identify the theme as well.

## INFORMATIONAL TEXT

- Summarizing an informational text for all grade levels includes finding the most important details.
- Identifying the central idea (what the text is mostly about) first helps the students find relevant details.
- If the details do not support the central idea, they are not relevant.
- Once you have the topic, and relevant details this will help the student create a summary.
- The nonfiction summary activity to the right helps students identify the topic and 3 relevant details to write a summary.

Fifth Grade	Summarize a text including the plot and theme.	Summarize a text including the central idea and relevant details.
Fourth Grade >	Summarize a text including plot and theme.	Summarize a text including the central idea and relevant details.
Third Grade	Summarize a text Including the plot and theme.	Summarize a text using the central idea and relevant details.
Second Grade	Retell a text using the main story elements in a logical sequence.	Retell a text using the central idea and relevant details.
First Grade >	Retell a text in oral or written form to using the main story elements at the beginning, middle, and end.	Retell a text in oral or written form using the topic and important details.
Kindergarten >	Retell a text orally using the main character(s), setting, and important events for a story.	Retell a text orally using topic and details.

Wanted:	What did the character want?
But:	What was the problem?
So:	How did a character try to solve the problem?
Then:	What was the solution to the problem?
