

According to Carnegie Learning "writing strengthens executive functions (the mental processes that enable us to plan, pay attention and juggle multiple tasks successfully)." I have included an example from each grade level and a brief description of what they should include in their writing. You can practice this at home by having them choose a topic (animals, sports, hobbies etc) and practice writing about them using this guideline and what they have been learning in school. Grades K-3 will need to practice their handwriting, while grades 4-5 need to practice their typing skills.


Using a combination of drawing, dictating, and/or writing, provide factual information about a topic.

First




Write expository texts about a topic, using a source, providing facts and a sense of closure.

Second




Write expository texts about a topic, using a source, providing an introduction, facts, transitions, and a conclusion.

Third




Write expository texts about a topic, using one or more sources, providing an introduction, facts and details, some elaboration, transitions, and a conclusion.

Write expository texts about a topic, using multiple sources, elaboration, and an organizational structure with transitions.

Write expository texts about a topic using multiple sources and including an organizational structure, relevant elaboration, and varied transitions.
