\*i-Ready: delivers student instruction, performance diagnostics, and progress reports based on K-12 Common Core State Standards (CCSS) in Mathematics and Reading. Students take the i-Ready Diagnostic and receive differentiated online instruction according to their ability.

\*Canvas: Students in grades 1-5 can access Go Math!, Science Fusion, and Journeys textbooks and fun interactive activities through Think Central. Once in the system, you simply click on My Library to access your Student Editions (it may take a while to load). Note you can go to any page in your book and access iTools (eManipulatives) and Animated Math. There are also some printable resources in the Student Library. Don't forget to investigate the Real World Videos!

\*myON: unlimited access to thousands of digital books that match each student's interests, grade and Lexile® level, and flexible scaffolds that make texts even more accessible for all readers. Literacy tools enable students to foster close connections to the text, further increasing engagement, and comprehension.

\*Khan MAP Practice: a customized playlist of math skills based on individual students' NWEA MAP test score.

## **Restorative Practices!**

BPE remains focused on implementing Restorative Practices campus wide. In our efforts to keep families informed, we will be adding little notes describing what Restorative Practices are as we go.

The purpose of Restorative Practices is to promote and strengthen positive school culture and enhance positive social relationships within the school community.

Restorative practices allow for a shift in practice that results in a culture which is inclusive, builds fair process into decision-making practices, and facilitates students' learning to address the impact of their actions through an

approach that allows for true accountability, skill building, cooperation, and mutual understanding.

Through restorative practices, members of the school community will:

- 1. have an opportunity to be heard
- 2. understand the greater impact of one's actions
- 3. learn to take responsibility
- 4. repair the harm one's actions may have caused
- 5. recognize one's role in maintaining a safe school environment
- 6. build upon and expand on personal relationships in the school community
- 7. recognize one's role as a positive contributing member of the school community.

Ultimately, people will learn to make positive, productive, and effective choices in response to situations they may encounter in the future after engaging in a restorative practice.
