We have a new gate. The old gate was getting filled with water and was not closing properly. We are still working on getting the cameras updated. Additional signs are looking to get posted. There was a meeting with the city about the buses.

### **Core Issues- Mrs. Snare**

There was a concern about a parent talking to another child aggressively. Another parent saw and wrote the core issue slip.

An electronic option for core issues is coming.

### **Principal's Report- Mrs. Price**

Mrs. Price went over the data. We always would like a progression! Right now, we are 66% proficient and 33% not proficient in English and in Math we are 60% proficient and 36% not proficient. The school will take the practice Science test in April.

The teachers met with the grade below them and the grade above to discuss strategies of what the children did not and need to know for the upcoming year!

Mrs. Price went over the engagement surveys.

Academic support, varying activities after school, and challenging students by their schoolwork are some of the things that families believe Tarpon Springs Fundamental needs to pull up at. Also, there was a suggestion about making PTA meetings more meaningful.

## Dress Code Open Forum
