The Superintendent is hereby authorized to approve and execute each such proposal for any amount up to \$250,000 ... The Superintendent will submit semi-annual reports to the Board summarizing grant proposals during the previous six (6) month period that were funded for amounts of \$250,000 or less.

The Special Projects Office processes approval of all grant applications and maintains records of all submissions.




