

**Superintendent Approval Report
Grant Projects under \$250,000
July 1, 2014 – December 31, 2014**

School Board policy 6110 governs the grant process and states in part: *The Superintendent shall review new grant funding opportunities including Federal, State, and private sector grants, and prepare proposals for programs s/he deems would be of aid to the students of this District. The Superintendent is hereby authorized to approve and execute each such proposal for any amount up to \$250,000 ... The Superintendent will submit semi-annual reports to the Board summarizing grant proposals during the previous six (6) month period that were funded for amounts of \$250,000 or less.*

The Special Projects Office processes approval of all grant applications and maintains records of all submissions.

Note: Education Foundation grants are preapproved and managed through the foundations; they are not included in this report.

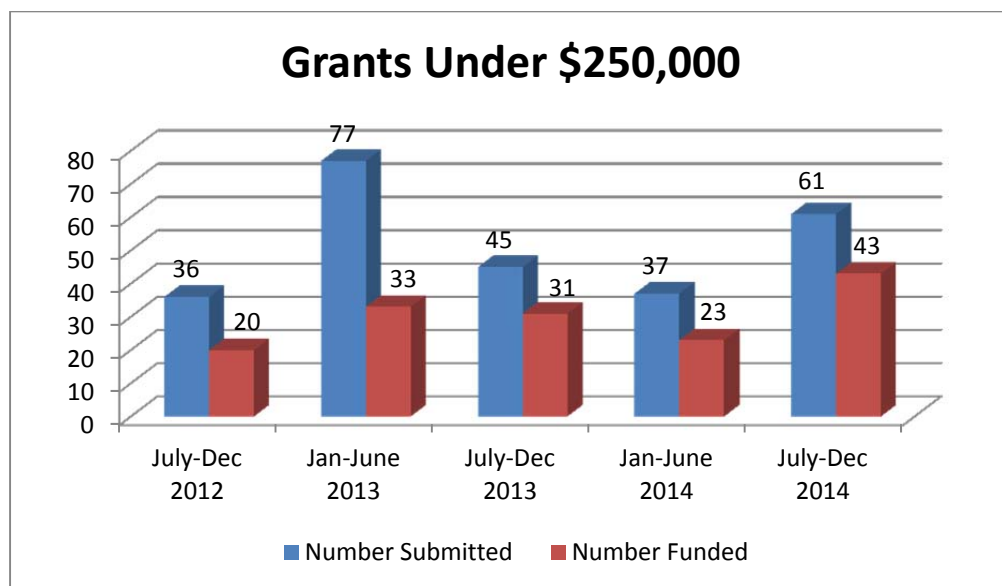

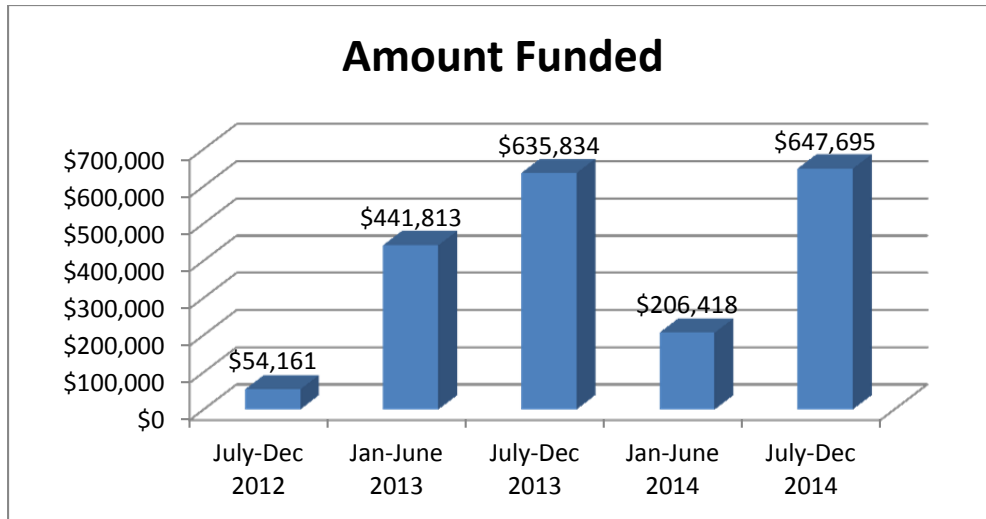
