Ask Palm Harbor University High School Head Lacrosse Coach Adam Deisley to say a few words about senior defender Jayden Griggs and you will undoubtedly get a novellength response.

"Jayden has been one of the best all-around players I have ever coached over the past 20 seasons," Deisley said. "He is the kind of kid every coach wants."

Deisley can list Griggs accolades – James Callahan Award for defensive player of the year in 2021 and 2022, team captain in 2022 and 2023, First team All-PCAC in 2021 and 2022, PCAC Championship MVP in 2023 – off the top of his head and is quick to point out his confidence and strong communication skills on the field. In the PCAC Championship game, Griggs helped lead his team in a come-from-behind victory against Osceola, putting some of his strongest talents on display.

"He has never been one to back down from a challenge," Deisley said. "He is literally like having a coach on the field."
