Limited seats available for PCS Summer Enrichment Camps

Applications for Pinellas County Schools Summer Camps are open! Families can choose from more than 50 summer camp offerings, ranging from STEM to the arts to fitness activities. The district is expanding camp opportunities and providing options in June and July. This year, camps will have a cost of \$75 per session and a rate of \$25 per session for students eligible for free- or reduced-price meals. Applications close March 9.

Due to changes to this year's Summer Bridge program, summer camps may be an appealing opportunity for more families. Elementary Summer Bridge will be for students who have demonstrated a need for extra support in reading based on state reading criteria. Middle School Summer Bridge will focus on credit recovery. Schools will be reaching out to parents whose children are eligible in the coming weeks. Registration for Summer Bridge will begin after spring break.

Although the club first launched more than two years ago, as pickleball has soared in popularity, so has St. Pete High students' interest in the sport. The club has more than doubled in size since its inception and now has its own courts on campus.

"This was a really underutilized area of campus," said Rachel Koral, the visual arts department chair and Pickleball Club sponsor of the dilapidated tennis courts behind the school. "So we've spent hours painting our own courts, which allows the club to meet right after school and play."
